County Executive Ryan McMahon Announces Public Hearings to Help Plan the Future of Aging Services in Onondaga County

Comments sought on 2020 Service Plan and Four Year Service Plan

SYRACUSE, N.Y. – County Executive J. Ryan McMahon, II announced that two public hearings will take place to help plan the future of aging services. Specifically, the Onondaga County Office for Aging is seeking input on the 2020 Service Plan as well as the Four Year Service Plan.

The second hearing will be held on Wednesday October 23rd from 1:00 P.M. to 2:30 P.M. at the Clay Town Hall located at 4401 State Route 31, Clay, N.Y. 13041.
