PUBLIC INFORMATION WEBSITE NOTICE FOR LAKESHORE ROAD BRIDGE PROJECT

The Onondaga County Department of Transportation will host a Public Information Website to present the proposed reconstruction of the Lakeshore Road Bridge over Maple Creek in the Town of Cicero from Wednesday, March 27, 2024 through Friday, April 19, 2024.

The proposed project is located on Lakeshore Road approximately 0.25 miles northerly of NYS Route 31 in the Town of Cicero. The existing single span concrete slab structure has a low condition rating based on the county biannual inspection. The entire superstructure will be replaced with a prestressed concrete slab, a waterproofing membrane and an asphalt wearing surface. An upgraded guide rail system will be installed. This project is scheduled for construction in 2025.

This project is a locally administered federal aid project. It is being progressed by Onondaga County Department of Transportation in coordination with the New York State Department of Transportation and the Federal Highway Administration. Presently, the project is in the preliminary design phase. A detailed overview of the project, along with a question and comment tab will be available at the web site. Representatives from the Onondaga County Department of Transportation and the design consultant will answer questions from interested parties, and will obtain comments and input for final design.
