RESOLUTION NO. 5

BOND RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$200,000 BONDS OF THE COUNTY OF ONONDAGA, NEW YORK, TO PAY COSTS OF IMPROVEMENTS FOR THE HARBOR BROOK DRAINAGE DISTRICT CONSISTING OF MISCELLANEOUS CULVERT AND CHANNEL IMPROVEMENTS

WHEREAS, by proceedings heretofore duly had and taken pursuant to the Onondaga County Administrative Code, the County of Onondaga has approved the improvements described herein; and

WHEREAS, it is now desired to provide for the financing of said improvements; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, by the affirmative vote of not less than two-thirds of the total voting strength of the County Legislature of the County of Onondaga, New York, as follows:

- <u>Section 1.</u> For the object or purpose of paying costs of improvements for the Harbor Brook Drainage District consisting of miscellaneous culvert and channel improvements, there are hereby authorized to be issued \$200,000 bonds of said County pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law.
- <u>Section 2.</u> SEQR DETERMINATION: It is hereby determined that the aforesaid purpose constitutes a Type II action as defined under regulations of the State of New York, promulgated under the State Environmental Quality Review Act, which, by such definition, will not have a significant adverse impact upon the environment.

<u>Section 3.</u> The maximum estimated cost of the aforesaid item is \$200,000, and the plan for the financing thereof shall consist of the issuance of the \$200,000 bonds of said County herein authorized; provided, however, that the amount of bonds to be issued shall be reduced to the extent of grants received in connection therewith.

- <u>Section 4.</u> It is hereby determined that the period of probable usefulness of the aforesaid class of objects or purposes is forty years, pursuant to subdivision 4 of paragraph a of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law.
- <u>Section 5.</u> The faith and credit of said County of Onondaga, New York, are hereby irrevocable pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds as the same respectively become due and payable. There shall annually be assessed upon the taxable real property in said Sanitary District in the manner provided by law an amount sufficient to pay said principal and interest as the same become due and payable, but if not paid from such source, all the taxable real property within said County shall be subject to the levy of ad valorem taxes sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds.
- Section 6. Subject to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance and sale of the bonds herein authorized, including renewals of such notes, is hereby delegated to the Chief Fiscal Officer, the chief fiscal officer. Such notes shall be of such terms, form and contents, and shall be sold in such manner, as may be prescribed by said Chief Fiscal Officer, consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

BOND RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE REPAVING OF THE E911 CENTER PARKING LOT IN AND FOR THE COUNTY OF ONONDAGA, NEW YORK, AT A MAXIMUM ESTIMATED

COST OF \$344,000, AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$344,000 BONDS OF SAID COUNTY TO PAY COSTS THEREOF

BE IT RESOLVED, by the affirmative vote of not less than two-thirds of the total voting strength of the County Legislature of the County of Onondaga, New York, as follows:

- <u>Section 1.</u> The Repaying of the E911 Center parking lot, including incidental costs in connection therewith, is hereby authorized at an estimated maximum cost of \$344,000.
- <u>Section 2.</u> The plan for the financing thereof is by the issuance of \$344,000 bonds of said County hereby authorized to be issued therefor.
- <u>Section 3.</u> It is hereby determined that the period of probable usefulness of the specific object or purpose is ten years, pursuant to subdivision 20(f) of paragraph a of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law.
- <u>Section 4.</u> The faith and credit of said County of Onondaga, New York, are hereby irrevocably pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds as the same respectively become due and payable. An annual appropriation shall be made in each year sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds becoming due and payable in such year. There shall annually be levied on all the taxable real property of said County a tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds as the same become due and payable.
- <u>Section 5.</u> Subject to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance and sale of the bonds herein authorized, including renewals of such notes, is hereby delegated to the Chief Fiscal Officer of such County. Such notes shall be of such terms, form and contents, and shall be sold in such manner, as may be prescribed by said Chief Fiscal Officer, consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.
- Section 6. All other matters except as provided herein relating to the bonds herein authorized including the date, denominations, maturities and interest payment dates, within the limitations prescribed herein and the manner of execution of the same, including the consolidation with other issues, and also the ability to issue bonds with substantially level or declining annual debt service, shall be determined by the Chief Fiscal Officer, the chief fiscal officer of such County. WHEREAS, this County Legislature duly adopted a resolution on December 1, 2020, calling a public hearing on the foregoing matter to be held in the Legislative Chambers in the County Court House, in Syracuse, New York on January 5, 2021, at 12:55 P.M., prevailing Eastern Time; and

WHEREAS, said public hearing was duly held at the time and place aforesaid, at which all persons interested were heard; and

WHEREAS, this County Legislature has given due consideration to the aforesaid Report and the evidence given at said public hearing; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, by the County Legislature of the County of Onondaga, New York, as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> Based upon the proceedings heretofore had and taken, it is hereby found and determined that it is necessary and in the public interest to approve the acquisition via forty-year lease, with option to renew for four additional ten-year terms and at a cost of one dollar per year, of the sanitary sewer infrastructure within the CSD owned by the Towns of Van Buren and Lysander and

Village of Baldwinsville, and that said acquisitions will be of special benefit to all of the real property included within the limits of the CSD.

Section 2. A certified copy of this resolution shall be recorded in the office of the County Clerk and when so recorded shall be presumptive evidence of the regularity of the determinations herein contained. The Clerk of the County Legislature is hereby authorized and directed to cause a notice of such recording to be published once in the official newspaper of said County in the manner provided by law.

LOCAL LAW NO. 2 - 2021

A LOCAL LAW AUTHORIZING THE LEASE OF SEWAGE DISPOSAL SYSTEMS FROM CERTAIN MUNICIPALITIES WITHIN THE ONONDAGA COUNTY CONSOLIDATED SANITARY DISTRICT FOR COUNTY PURPOSES

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY LEGISLATURE OF THE COUNTY OF ONONDAGA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Purpose. A well-maintained public sewer system is a valuable community asset. The purpose of this local law is to lease, for county purposes, public sewage disposal systems owned by certain municipalities, thereby enhancing opportunities for economic development and regional prosperity.

Section 2. Findings. The Baldwinsville Seneca Knolls and Metropolitan Syracuse service areas are located within the Onondaga County Consolidated Sanitary District. The Town of Van Buren, Town of Lysander, and Village of Baldwinsville, or portions thereof, are located within the Baldwinsville Seneca Knolls and/or Metropolitan Syracuse service areas ("Participating Municipalities"). The Participating Municipalities own and operate sewage disposal systems, in varying degrees of age and condition, which ultimately convey sewage to the County-owned Baldwinsville Seneca Knolls and/or Metropolitan Syracuse wastewater treatment plants.

Leasing the Participating Municipalities' sewage disposal systems to the County allows for increased economies and efficiencies. Properly maintained sewers prevent inflow and infiltration from entering the sewer system, thereby protecting the County from expending limited financial resources to treat clean water and preventing the County and its ratepayers from incurring unnecessary and costly facility expansion expenses. In addition, the County is responsible to state and federal regulators for the "end of pipe" treatment plant discharges, with the County, as well as the Participating Municipalities, subject to fines and penalties for system malfunctions and/or permit exceedances. Challenges amplify during wet weather conditions, where increased flows become unpredictable in quantity and quality. Leasing the Participating Municipalities' sewage disposal systems to the County allows for enhanced capacity management and improved compliance, in addition to promoting stewardship of the natural resources enjoyed by the community as a whole.

Section 3. Leases and Agreements Authorized. The leasing, for county purposes, of the sewage disposal systems within the Onondaga County Consolidated Sanitary District (CSD) owned by the Town of Van Buren, Town of Lysander, and Village of Baldwinsville is hereby authorized. The leased sewage disposal systems include sanitary sewers and exclude stormwater conveyances, with the exception of public combined sanitary/stormwater conveyances existing at the time of the effective

date of the lease with the respective municipality and until any such public combined sanitary/stormwater conveyance is separated, at which time the separated sanitary sewer conveyance is included within the respective lease and the separated stormwater conveyance excluded from said lease. The leases further include the real and personal property comprising or related to such leased sewage disposal systems and consist of, inter alia, all land, buildings, basins, pump stations, outfalls, storage facilities or mechanisms, structures, fixtures (including interceptors and collection lines), improvements, and real property interests such as easements, access rights, rights of way, permits, licenses and leases. The leases are for a period not to exceed forty (40) years, with four (4) possible consecutive renewals of ten (10) years each. The leases authorize the County, if and as may be agreed to by the County Executive, to pay each Participating Municipality an amount not to exceed \$200,000 to be used towards sewage disposal system debt obligations remaining after the use of each Participating Municipality's existing surplus sewer funds to reduce or retire such outstanding debt. Alternatively, at each Participating Municipality's election and in conjunction with a village main street or a town center or hamlet development project, the County may perform up to Two Hundred Thousand dollars (\$200,000.00) worth of WEP-approved green infrastructure projects. The consideration for the leases shall be one dollar per year and the continued benefit to the public of a long-term, strong and sustainable sewer system and the anticipated efficiencies and cost savings to be gained from consolidated administration and operation of the sewer assets. The County Executive is authorized to enter in said leases and such other documents and agreements reasonably necessary to effectuate the leases and implement the intent of this local law.

Section 4. Effective Date.

This local law shall take effect upon filing, consistent with the provisions of Municipal Home Rule Law

LOCAL LAW NO. 1 - 2021

A LOCAL LAW TO AMEND THE ONONDAGA COUNTY HOTEL ROOM OCCUPANCY TAX (ROT) LAW, BEING LOCAL LAW NO. 4 of 1975, AS AMENDED, BY INCREASING FROM FIVE PERCENT TO SEVEN PERCENT THE TAX ON HOTEL OR MOTEL OCCUPANCY IN ONONDAGA COUNTY

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY LEGISLATURE OF ONONDAGA COUNTY, NEW YORK, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 3, subdivision 2 of Onondaga County Hotel Room Occupancy Tax (ROT) Law, being Local Law No. 4 of 1975, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

2. Imposition of Tax.

On and after the first day of March, two thousand and twenty-one, there is hereby imposed and there shall be paid a tax of seven percent (7%) upon the rent for every occupancy of a room or rooms in a hotel in this county except that the tax shall not be imposed upon (1) a permanent resident, or (2) where the rent is not more than at the rate of four dollars per day.

Said rate of tax of five percent (5%) shall be increased to seven (7%) effective on the first day of March, two thousand twenty –one (2021).

Section 2. This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon proper filing with the Office of the Secretary of State pursuant to Section 27 of the Municipal Home Rule Law.

Pursuant to Section 209(3)(e) of the New York Civil Service Law, as the Chief Executive Officer of Onondaga County (the "County"), I hereby refer the above-referenced matter to the Onondaga County Legislature for the purpose of requesting that a public hearing be held for calendar year 2019.

At the conclusion of each hearing, I request that the Legislature issue a legislative determination regarding the terms and conditions of employment for the DSBA bargaining unit members for this time period.

The most recent collective bargaining agreement between the County and D SBA expired on December 31, 2018. Following the expiration of that agreement, the parties engaged in negotiations for a successor agreement: This process proved unsuccessful and resulted in a bar gaining impasse. The subsequent mediation process implemented by the New York Public Employment Relations Board ("PERB") was also unsuccessful, and PERB ultimately appointed Marc Reitz to serve as Fact-Finder. On February 22, 2021, Mr. Reitz issued his Fact-Finding Report and Recommendations (Attached hereto as Exhibit A.) The Report and Recommendations are not acceptable as written, and are therefore rejected.

Pursuant to the Taylor Law, the Legislature is prohibited from imposing a settlement with terms that would diminish employee rights under the parties' expired collective bargaining agreement: As such, it is my recommendation that the Legislature settle this impasse with the following terms and conditions for calendar year 2019: 0% increase to wages and no other changes.

WHEREAS, the Onondaga County Legislature seeks to exclude residential energy sources and related services in the levy calculation of local sales and use tax effective June 1, 2021; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Onondaga County Legislature does hereby amend Resolution 371-1967, as amended by Resolution No. 582-1979 and Resolution No. 86-2020, by amending paragraph (1) of subdivision (j) of Section 6 thereof to read as follows:

(1) Receipts from the retail sale or use of fuel oil (excluding diesel motor fuel) and coal used for residential purposes and the receipts from the retail sale or use of wood used for residential heating purposes shall be exempt from the tax on retail sales imposed by subdivision (a) of Section 2 and the compensating use tax imposed under Section 4 of this Resolution, and the receipts from every sale other than for resale of propane (except when sold in containers of less than one hundred pounds), natural gas, electricity, steam and gas, electric and steam services used for residential purposes shall be exempt from the tax imposed by subdivision (b) of Section 2 of this Resolution. Notwithstanding any other provisions of this subdivision, the exemption set forth in this subdivision shall not apply to sales made or uses occurring during the period commencing on September 1, 2020 and ending on May 31, 2021.

WHEREAS, the Finger Lakes Region is distinguished by eleven pristine lakes formed over 19,000 years ago at the end of the "Ice Age" that have over the years been Native American hunting grounds and villages, rich agricultural lands that inspired settlement, villages, small towns, mid-sized cities, and a world-renowned wine industry, which have together formed a unique and distinctive landscape; and

WHEREAS, the United States Congress has the authority to designate National Heritage Areas that encompass a region where natural, cultural, historic and recreational resources combine to form a cohesive, nationally distinctive landscape shaped by geography and cultural traditions; and

Dingell, Jr. Conservation, Management and Recreation Act of 2019, which directed the Secretary of the Interior to evaluate the natural, historic, cultural, educational, and recreational resources of the Finger Lakes Region including the following counties: Cayuga, Chemung, Cortland, Livingston, Monroe, Onondaga, Ontario, Schuyler, Seneca, Steuben, Tioga, Tompkins, Wayne, and Yates: and

WHEREAS, Onondaga County legislature supports the Finger Lakes National Heritage Area designation and the inclusion of all fourteen counties including Cayuga, Chemung, Cortland, Livingston, Monroe, Onondaga, Ontario, Schuyler, Seneca, Steuben, Tioga, Tompkins, Wayne, and Yates counties in the National Heritage Area, and supports the Finger Lakes Tourism Alliance in their current and future leadership role in administering the National Heritage Area; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that this Onondaga County Legislature hereby designates support for the Finger Lakes Tourism Region, encompassing all fourteen counties of the Finger Lakes region, be named a National Heritage Area as determined by the National Parks Service.

RESOLUTION NO. 62

AMENDING THE COUNTY POLICY FOR REIMBURSEMENT OF EMPLOYEES' PERSONAL PROPERTY LOST OR DAMAGED, WHILE WORKING

WHEREAS, the County of Onondaga has a policy for reimbursement of employees' personal property that has been lost or damaged, while working for the County; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 620/1978, the Legislature established a uniform policy to handle employee reimbursement claims of lost or damaged personal property administratively; and

WHEREAS, on April 1, 2002, Resolution No. 81/2002, made permanent the provisions of Resolution No. 86-2001, that modified and improved the policy by creating a uniform policy for all departments and clarifying the standard to be used in authorizing reimbursement; and

WHEREAS, this Legislature seeks to amend resolution No. 81/2002 and increase the amount an individual department may authorize reimbursement, if it is determined that the conditions and standards are met; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Onondaga County Legislature hereby amends Resolution No. 81/2002 to continue the following standards and policies governing the payment for loss or damaged employee personal property:

- 1. An employee may be eligible for reimbursement for lost or damaged property if it is determined that the loss or damage:
 - a. occurred within the scope of the employees' regular duties or was directly related thereto:
 - the lost or damaged property was being used by the employee in the performance of the employees' duties at the time of loss or damage;

 was caused by a person or instrumentality related to the County mission that the employee was engaged in at time the loss or damage occurred;

- that the employee was not in whole or in part contributorily responsible for the loss or damage.
- For claims of \$500 or less, the department head may authorize reimbursement if, after investigation, it is determined that conditions and standards set forth in paragraph (1) are met
- For claims greater than \$500, but less than \$1,000, the Law Department may authorize reimbursement if, after investigation, it is determined that the conditions and standards set forth in paragraph (1) are met.
- 4. For claims between \$1,000 and \$5,000, the Legislature may authorize reimbursement if, after review of the department and/or the Law Department investigation results, it is determined that the conditions and standards set forth in paragraph (1) are met.

LOCAL LAW NO. 3 - 2021

A LOCAL LAW AUTHORIZING THE SALE OF COUNTY PROPERTY LOCATED OFF WEST DEAD CREEK ROAD AND ELDERBERRY STREET IN THE TOWN OF VAN BUREN

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY LEGISLATURE OF THE COUNTY OF ONONDAGA, AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. Findings. The County of Onondaga is the owner of a 1.79 acre \pm parcel of vacant rural land located at the intersection of West Dead Creek Road and Elderberry Street in the Town of Van Buren and bearing tax map no. 046.-04-08.0 (Property). Adjoining property owner Mary Waterman has expressed an interest in purchasing said Property for a consideration of \$3,400.00. Appraisal of the Property has been obtained; and such consideration is equal to the assessed, and greater than the appraised, value. The Property is not needed for County purposes.
- Section 2. Environmental Review. An analysis of the potential environmental impacts, if any, has been done under the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) and, as lead agency, the County hereby determines that the proposed action is an Unlisted Action under SEQRA and a Short Environmental Assessment Form has been prepared. The Short Environmental Assessment Form filed with this Legislature is satisfactory with respect to scope and content and adequacy in compliance with SEQRA and is hereby accepted by the County. Onondaga County does hereby make and adopt a Negative Declaration for the project, and has determined that the proposed action will not have a significant effect on the environment. The Onondaga County Executive, or his designee, is authorized to take such action to comply with the requirements of SEQRA, including without limitation, the execution of documentation and filing of same and any other actions to implement the intent of this local law.
- Section 3. Sale Authorized. The County Executive is hereby authorized to transfer to Mary Waterman said Property for a consideration of \$3,400.00. The County Executive is hereby authorized to execute agreements to further the intent of this local law.
- Section 4. Effective Date. This local law shall be filed and take effect in accordance with provisions of the Municipal Home Rule Law and is subject to a permissive referendum.

LOCAL LAW NO. 4 - 2021

A LOCAL LAW AMENDING ARTICLE VI OF THE ONONDAGA COUNTY CHARTER AND FURTHER AMENDING ARTICLE VI OF THE ONONDAGA COUNTY ADMINISTRATIVE CODE WITH RESPECT TO THE 2022 COUNTY BUDGET CYCLE

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY LEGISLATURE OF ONONDAGA COUNTY AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The annual county budget process, including presentation, review, consideration, adoption and implementation, is governed by the procedures found within the Onondaga County Charter (Local Law No. 1 - 1961, as previously amended, hereinafter referred to as "Charter") and the Onondaga County Administrative Code (being Local Law No. 1 - 1975, as previously amended, hereinafter referred to as "Administrative Code"). Solely with respect to the 2022 annual county budget, it is desired to change certain prescribed dates within such annual budget cycle as provided herein.

- a. The Charter is hereby amended regarding the 2022 annual county budget, as follows:
- i. With respect to the submission of the tentative budget to the Legislature, Section 603 is amended in the first sentence of the first paragraph to strike the words "fifteenth day of September" and to substitute "fifth day of October" therefor.
- ii. With respect to the report filed by the Ways and Means Committee, Section 603 is further amended in the first sentence of the final paragraph to strike the words "the first day of October" and to substitute "the fifteenth of October" therefor.
- iii. With respect to the publication of the public hearing notice, Section 604 is amended in the first sentence to strike the words "the first day of October" and to substitute "the sixteenth day of October" therefor.
- iv. With respect to the date by which the public hearing must be held, Section 604 is further amended in the first sentence to strike the words "not later than the tenth day of October" and to substitute "not later than the twenty-first day of October" therefor.
- v. With respect to the adoption of the budget by the Legislature with additions or increases, Section 605(b) is amended to strike the words "the fifteenth day of October" and to substitute "the twenty-sixth day of October" therefor.
- vi. With respect to the County Executive's objections to such additions or increases, Section 605(c) is amended to strike the words "the twentieth day of October" and to substitute "five days after the adoption of the budget with additions or increases, but in any event not later than the thirty-first day of October" therefor, and Section 605(d) is amended to strike the words "on or before the twentieth day of October" and to substitute "on the date provided in Section 605(c) for the return of such budget by the County Executive" therefor.
- vii. With respect to the Legislature's special meeting to reconsider such objections, Section 605(c) is amended to strike the words "the twenty-fifth day of October" and to substitute "five days after the return of the budget with additions or increases, but in any event not later than the fifth day of November" therefor.
- viii. With respect to the final date in the budget adoption process, Section 605(e) is amended to strike the words "the first Monday of November" and to substitute "the twelfth day of November" therefor.
- b. The Administrative Code is hereby amended regarding the 2022 annual county budget, as follows:
- i. With respect to the submission of Capital Project Requests, Section 6.02(a) is amended to strike the words "or before the first day of June of each year, or on such earlier date" and to substitute "on or before the first of July" therefor.
- ii. With respect to the submission of the estimates and appropriation requests to the Chief Fiscal Officer, Section 6.03B is amended to strike the words "or before this first day of August of each year, or on such earlier date" and to substitute "on or before the first day of September" therefor.
- iii. With respect to the submission of the Executive's budget to the Legislature, Section 6.05(b) is amended to strike the words "the fifteenth day of September" and to substitute "the fifth day of October" therefor.
- iv. With respect to the report filed by the Ways and Means Committee, Section 6.07 is amended to strike the word "the first day of October" and to substitute "the fifteenth day of October" therefor.

v. With respect to the public hearing, Section 6.08 is stricken in its entirety and the following language is to be substituted therefor "The public hearing shall be noticed and held in the manner prescribed by Section 604 of the Charter."

Section 2. Additional Amendments; Construction.

Any previously enacted resolutions or local laws relating to the annual budget cycle and financial procedures in Onondaga County are hereby amended to be consistent with this local law. Except as specifically amended herein, the Onondaga County Charter and Administrative Code remain in full force and effect.

This local law is to be construed in such a way so as not to diminish or curtail any powers held by any elected official within County government.

Section 3. Severability.

In the event that any provision contained herein should be found by a judge to be improper, illegal, and/or void, it is the intent of this Legislature to sever such provisions from this local law and to revive and restore the relevant provisions of the Charter and Administrative Code to the status quo ante.

Section 4. Applicability to 2022 Annual County Budget.

The amendments herein to the prescribed dates in the Charter and Administrative Code shall be effective regarding only the 2022 annual county budget. Upon adoption of the 2022 budget, the amendments herein shall expire automatically, and the Charter and Administrative Code shall be restored to the prescribed dates in effect immediately prior to the adoption of this local law, without need for further legislative action, and shall read as though the prescribed dates were not amended.

Section 5. Effective Date.

This local law shall take effect upon filing in accordance with the Municipal Home Rule Law.

CALLING FOR A PUBLIC HEARING FOR ADOPTING A PILOT YOUTH DEER HUNTING PROGRAM

WHEREAS, Environmental Conservation Law §11-0935, establishes a pilot program wherein a hunting license holder who is 12 or 13 years of age may hunt deer with a crossbow, rifle, shotgun or muzzle loading firearm in areas where and during the hunting season in which such implements may be used; and

WHEREAS, Environmental Conservation Law \$11-0935 requires that in order to be an "eligible area", a county must pass a local law authorizing participation in the pilot program; and

WHEREAS, according to a 2011 U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service study, the community spends approximately \$4.95 billion per year in the State of New York in pursuit of sporting activities, and sporting activities are responsible for the support of approximately 56,000 jobs across New York State; and

WHEREAS, sporting activities have a positive impact on the local and statewide economy; and

WHEREAS, public interest and participation in sporting activities, including deer hunting, has significantly increased, including the number of individuals completing hunter education programs and purchasing hunting and other sporting licenses; and

WHEREAS, the universal hunting age of 12 is supported by the 2012-2016 NYS Deer Management Plan and the draft 2021-2025 NYS Deer Management Plan; and

WHEREAS, prior to the adoption of Environmental Conservation Law §11-0935, 49 out of 50 States with New York being the exception, permitted 12 and 13 year olds to participate in hunting under varying circumstances; and

WHEREAS, hunting with youth provides quality time for parents, guardians and other mentor figures to bond with their children, other family members and friends in an outdoor setting and presents an excellent opportunity to introduce youth to nature, stewardship, conservation, and responsible wildlife management; and

WHEREAS, hunting with youth provides an opportunity to mentor and instruct youth hunters regarding safe and responsible hunting; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that pursuant to Environmental Conservation Law §11-0935, a public hearing will be held to consider the above requests for opting-in to the provisions of the Pilot Youth Deer Hunting Program, which hearing shall be held at the Onondaga County Court House, County Legislative Chambers, 4th Floor, 401 Montgomery Street, Syracuse, New York on July, 6, 2021 at 12:50 p.m.; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the Clerk of this Legislature hereby is directed to cause publication of such hearing pursuant to applicable law.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 6304 of the Education Law, as amended by Chapter 631 of the Laws of 1965 and pursuant to Article VI of the Onondaga County Charter, the Ways and Means Committee has reviewed the tentative proposed Onondaga Community College Budget for the fiscal year September 1, 2021, to August 31, 2022, having held a public hearing upon such tentative proposed budget on May 25, 2021, pursuant to Resolution No. 35-2021, adopted on May 4, 2021, and all persons desiring to be heard were heard at such public hearing; and

WHEREAS, the total Tentative Community College Budget presented to this Legislature was in the estimated amount of \$64,526,731 required for Community College Operating Fund purposes. From this estimated total of \$64,526,731 for the Community College Operating Fund was deducted the amount of \$54,654,731 estimated as revenues, leaving a net budget for the Community College Operating Fund subject to tax levy of \$9,872,000 (Tentative Local Sponsor's Contribution). The total amount estimated for grants to be received by the Community College in 2021-2022 is \$14,000,000; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that said 2021-2022 Tentative Community College Budget heretofore prepared and submitted by the County Executive and subsequently reviewed by the Ways and Means Committee as hereinafter set forth, be and the same hereby is adopted for 2021-2022 with no changes; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the Adopted Operating Budget for Onondaga Community College for the fiscal year September 1, 2021, through August 31, 2022, in the amount of \$64,526,731 with the County financial assistance of \$9,872,000 be and hereby is approved; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the estimated grant activity in the Community College's 2021-2022 Annual Budget is \$14,000,000; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that expenditures from this budget be made by the Board of Trustees of Onondaga Community College pursuant to the provisions of Resolution No. 111 - 1970 by this County Legislature and that such expenditures be subject to the terms and conditions of such appropriations and to such regulations regarding the custody, deposit, audit and payment thereof as this County Legislature may deem proper; and, be it further

AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 67-2020 TO INCREASE THE AUTHORIZATION TO PAY IN THE FIRST INSTANCE 100 PERCENT OF THE FEDERAL AND STATE AID ELIGIBLE COSTS BY AN ADDITIONAL \$380,000 FOR THE CONSTRUCTION AND CONSTRUCTION INSPECTION PHASES OF THE OLD ROUTE 5 (CR 98) AND WARNERS ROAD (CR 63) PAVING (2R) PROJECT, PIN 3755.69, AND AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF AGREEMENTS

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 67-2020, this Legislature: approved the Old Route 5 and Warners Road project, PIN 3755.69, at a total Project cost of \$4,200,000; agreed to participate and pay up to 100 percent of the County share (\$210,000); and authorized the Comptroller to pay in the first instance the total federal and state shares of the cost of the Construction and Construction Inspection phases (\$3,990,000); and

WHEREAS, the total additional cost of the Construction and Construction Inspection phases is now estimated at \$400,000, with the additional federal share estimated at \$320,000 (80 percent of the total additional cost) and the additional non-federal share estimated at \$80,000 (20 percent of the total additional cost); and

WHEREAS, with these additional costs, the total estimated cost is now \$4,600,000, with the estimated County share now being \$230,000 (5 percent), and the total estimated federal and state share now being \$4,370,000 (95 percent); and

WHEREAS, the State of New York requires Onondaga County to contribute up to 100 percent of the non-federal share of the phases of this project, and to pay in the first instance the total federal and state shares of the cost of the phases; and

WHEREAS, the County of Onondaga desires to pay in the first instance the additional federal and state shares of the costs (\$380,000) for the above project; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that this Legislature hereby approves the project, agrees to participate and pay up to 100 percent of the non-federal share of the project, and agrees to pay in the first instance, up to 100 percent of the total federal and state shares (\$4,370,000); and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the County Executive is hereby authorized to execute agreements with the New York State of Department of Transportation approving the above-mentioned project, providing for County participation in the cost of the local share of the project, and otherwise implementing the intent of this resolution; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that Resolution No. 67-2020 is hereby amended to be consistent with this resolution, and to authorize payment in the first instance of the additional \$380,000 beyond those funds provided in Resolution No. 67-2020; and be it further

LOCAL LAW NO. 5 - 2021

A LOCAL LAW TO ESTABLISH A SUSTAINABLE ENERGY LOAN PROGRAM (OPEN C-PACE) IN THE COUNTY OF ONONDAGA

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY OF ONONDAGA (THE "MUNICIPALITY") AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. This local law shall be known as the "Energize NY Open C-PACE Financing Program" and shall read as follows:

ARTICLE V

- §1. Legislative findings, intent and purpose, authority.
- It is the policy of both the Municipality and the State of New York (the "State") to A. achieve energy efficiency and renewable energy improvements, reduce greenhouse gas emissions, mitigate the effect of global climate change, and advance a clean energy economy. The Municipality finds that it can fulfill this policy by providing property assessed clean energy financing to Qualified Property Owners (as defined below) for the installation of renewable energy systems and energy efficiency measures. This local law establishes a program that will allow the Energy Improvement Corporation (as defined below, "EIC"), a local development corporation, acting on behalf of the Municipality pursuant to the municipal agreement (the "Municipal Agreement") to be entered into between the Municipality and EIC, to make funds available to Qualified Property Owners that will be repaid through charges on the real properties benefited by such funds, thereby fulfilling the purposes of this local law and accomplishing an important public purpose. This local law provides a method of implementing the public policies expressed by, and exercising the authority provided by, Article 5-L of the General Municipal Law (as defined below, the "Enabling Act").
- B. The Municipality is authorized to execute, deliver and perform the Municipal Agreement and otherwise to implement this Energize NY Open C-PACE Financing Program pursuant to the Constitution and laws of New York, including particularly Article IX of the Constitution, Section 10 of the Municipal Home Rule Law, the Enabling Act and this local law.
- C. This local law, which is adopted pursuant to Section 10 of the Municipal Home Rule Law and the Enabling Act shall be known and may be cited as the "Energize NY Open C-PACE Local Law".
- §2. Definitions
- A. Capitalized terms used but not defined herein have the meanings assigned in the Enabling Act.
- B. For purposes of this local law, and unless otherwise expressly stated or unless the context requires, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

Annual Installment Amount – shall have the meaning assigned in Section 8, paragraph B.

Annual Installment Lien - shall have the meaning assigned in Section 8 paragraph B.

Authority – the New York State Energy Research and Development Authority.

Benefit Assessment Lien – shall have the meaning assigned in Section 3, paragraph A.

Benefited Property – Qualified Property for which the Qualified Property Owner has entered into a Finance Agreement for a Qualified Project.

Benefited Property Owner – the owner of record of a Benefited Property.

 ${\rm EIC}$ – the Energy Improvement Corporation, a local development corporation, duly organized under section 1411 of the Not-For-Profit Corporation Law of the State, authorized hereby on behalf of the Municipality to implement the Program by providing funds to Qualified Property Owners and providing for repayment of such funds from money collected by or on behalf of the Municipality as a charge to be levied on the real property.

Eligible Costs – costs incurred by the Benefited Property Owner in connection with a Qualified Project and the related Finance Agreement, including application fees, EIC's Program administration fee, closing costs and fees, title and appraisal fees, professionals' fees, permits, fees for design and drawings and any other related fees, expenses and costs, in each case as approved by EIC and the Financing Party under the Finance Agreement.

Enabling Act – Article 5-L of the General Municipal Law of the State, or a successor law, as in effect from time to time.

Finance Agreement – the finance agreement described in Section 6A of this local law.

Financing Charges – all charges, fees and expenses related to the loan under the Finance Agreement including accrued interest, capitalized interest, prepayment premiums, and penalties as a result of a default or late payment and costs and reasonable attorneys' fees incurred by the Financing Party as a result of a foreclosure or other legal proceeding brought against the Benefited Property to enforce any delinquent Annual Installment Liens.

Financing Parties – Third party capital providers approved by EIC to provide financing to Qualified Property Owners or other financial support to the Program which have entered into separate agreements with EIC to administer the Program in the Municipality.

Municipality – the County of Onondaga, a municipality of the State constituting a tax district as defined in Section 1102 of the RPTL of the State.

Municipal Lien - a lien on Qualified Property which secures the obligation to pay real property taxes, municipal charges, or governmentally imposed assessments in respect of services or benefits to a Qualified Property.

Non-Municipal Lien – a lien on Qualified Property which secures any obligation other than the obligation to pay real property taxes, municipal charges, or governmentally-imposed assessments in respect of services or benefits to a Qualified Property Owner or Qualified Property.

Program - the Energize NY Open C-PACE Financing Program authorized hereby.

Qualified Project – the acquisition, construction, reconstruction or equipping of Energy Efficiency Improvements or Renewable Energy Systems or other projects authorized under the Enabling Act on a Qualified Property, together with a related Energy Audit, Renewable Energy System Feasibility Study and/or other requirements under or pursuant to the Enabling Act, with funds provided in whole or in part by Financing Parties under the Program to achieve the purposes of the Enabling Act.

Qualified Property – Any real property other than a residential building containing less than three dwelling units, which is within the boundaries of the Municipality that has been determined to be eligible to participate in the Program under the procedures for eligibility set forth under this local law and the Enabling Act and has become the site of a Qualified Project.

Qualified Property Owner – the owner of record of Qualified Property which has been determined by EIC to meet the requirements for participation in the Program as an owner, and any transferee owner of such Qualified Property.

RPTL - the Real Property Tax Law of the State, as amended from time to time.

Secured Amount – as of any date, the aggregate amount of principal loaned to the Qualified Property Owner for a Qualified Project, together with Eligible Costs and Financing Charges, as provided herein or in the Finance Agreement, as reduced pursuant to Section 8, paragraph C.

State - the State of New York.

- §3. Establishment of an Energize NY Open C-PACE Financing Program
- A. An Energize NY Open C-PACE Financing Program is hereby established by the Municipality, whereby EIC acting on its behalf pursuant to the Municipal Agreement, may arrange for the provision of funds by Financing Parties to Qualified Property Owners in accordance with the Enabling Act and the procedures set forth under this local law, to finance the acquisition, construction, reconstruction, and installation of Qualified Projects and Eligible Costs and Financing Charges approved by EIC and by the Financing Party under the Finance Agreement. EIC, on behalf of the Municipality, and with the consent of the Benefited Property Owner, will record a Benefit Assessment Lien on the Benefited Property in the Secured Amount (the "Benefit Assessment Lien") on the land records for the Municipality. Such recording shall be exempt from any charge, mortgage recording tax or other fee in the same manner as if recorded by the Municipality.
- B. Before a Qualified Property Owner and a Financing Party enter into a Finance Agreement which results in a loan to finance a Qualified Project, repayment of which is secured by a Benefit Assessment Lien, a written consent from each existing mortgage holder of the Qualified Property shall be obtained, permitting the Benefit Assessment Lien and each Annual Installment Lien to take priority over all existing

mortgages.

§4. Procedures for eligibility

A. Any property owner in the Municipality may submit an application to EIC on such forms as have been prepared by EIC and made available to property owners on the website of EIC and at the Municipality's offices.

- B. Every application submitted by a property owner shall be reviewed by EIC, acting on behalf of the Municipality, which shall make a positive or negative determination on such application based upon the criteria enumerated in the Enabling Act and §5 of this local law. EIC may also request further information from the property owner where necessary to aid in its determination.
- C. If a positive determination on an application is made by EIC, acting on behalf of the Municipality, the property owner shall be deemed a Qualified Property Owner and shall be eligible to participate in the Program in accordance with § 6 of this local law.

§5. Application criteria

Upon the submission of an application, EIC, acting on behalf of the Municipality, shall make a positive or negative determination on such application based upon the following criteria for the making of a financing:

- A. The property owner may not be in bankruptcy and the property may not constitute property subject to any pending bankruptcy proceeding;
- B. The amount financed under the Program shall be repaid over a term not to exceed the weighted average of the useful life of Renewable Energy Systems and Energy Efficiency Improvements to be installed on the property as determined by EIC;
- Sufficient funds are available from Financing Parties to provide financing to the property owner;
- D. The property owner is current in payments on any existing mortgage on the Qualified Property;
- E. The property owner is current in payments on any real property taxes on the Qualified Property; and
- F. Such additional criteria, not inconsistent with the criteria set forth above, as the State, the Municipality, or EIC acting on its behalf, or other Financing Parties may set from time to time.

§6. Energize NY Finance Agreement

- A. A Qualified Property Owner may participate in the Program through the execution of a finance agreement made by and between the Qualified Property Owner and a Financing Party, to which EIC, on behalf of the Municipality, shall be a third-party beneficiary (the "Finance Agreement"). Upon execution and delivery of the Finance Agreement, the property that is the subject of the Finance Agreement shall be deemed a "Benefited Property").
- B. Upon execution and delivery of the Finance Agreement, the Benefited Property
 Owner shall be eligible to receive funds from the Financing Party for the acquisition,

construction, and installation of a Qualified Project, together with Eligible Costs and Financing Charges approved by EIC and by the Financing Party, provided the requirements of the Enabling Act, the Municipal Agreement and this local law have been met.

- C. The Finance Agreement shall include the terms and conditions of repayment of the Secured Amount and the Annual Installment Amounts.
- D. EIC may charge fees to offset the costs of administering the Program and such fees, if not paid by the Financing Party, shall be added to the Secured Amount.
- §7. Terms and conditions of repayment

The Finance Agreement shall set forth the terms and conditions of repayment in accordance with the following:

- A. The principal amount of the funds loaned to the Benefited Property Owner for the Qualified Project, together with Eligible Costs and Financing Charges approved by EIC and by the Financing Party, shall be specially assessed against the Benefited Property and will be evidenced by a Benefit Assessment Lien recorded against the Benefited Property on the land records on which liens are recorded for properties within the Municipality. The special benefit assessment shall constitute a "charge" within the meaning of the Enabling Act and shall be collected in annual installments in the amounts certified by the Financing Party in a schedule provided at closing and made part of the Benefit Assessment Lien. Said amount shall be annually levied, billed and collected by EIC, on behalf of the Municipality, and shall be paid to the Financing Party as provided in the Finance Agreement.
- B. The term of such repayment shall be determined at the time the Finance Agreement is executed by the Benefited Property Owner and the Financing Party, not to exceed the weighted average of the useful life of the systems and improvements as determined by EIC, acting on behalf of the Municipality.
- C. The rate of interest for the Secured Amount shall be fixed by the Financing Party in conjunction with EIC, acting on behalf of the Municipality, as provided in the Finance Agreement.
- §8. Levy of Annual Installment Amount and Creation of Annual Installment Lien
- A. Upon the making of the loan pursuant to the Finance Agreement, the Secured Amount shall become a special Benefit Assessment Lien on the Benefited Property in favor of the Municipality. The amount of the Benefit Assessment Lien shall be the Secured Amount. Evidence of the Benefit Assessment Lien shall be recorded by EIC, on behalf of the Municipality, in the land records for properties in the Municipality. Such recording shall be exempt from any charge, mortgage recording tax or other fee in the same manner as if recorded by the Municipality. The Benefit Assessment Lien shall not be foreclosed upon by or otherwise enforced by the Municipality.
- B. The Finance Agreement shall provide for the repayment of the Secured Amount in installments made at least annually, as provided in a schedule attached to the Benefit Assessment Lien (the "Annual Installment Amount"). The Annual Installment Amount shall be levied by EIC, on behalf of the Municipality, on the Benefited Property in the same manner as levies for municipal charges, shall become a lien on the Benefited Property as of the first day of January of the fiscal year for which levied

(the "Annual Installment Lien") and shall remain a lien until paid. The creation or any recording of the Annual Installment Lien shall be exempt from any charge, mortgage recording tax or other fee in the same manner as if recorded by the Municipality. Payment to the Financing Party shall be considered payment for this purpose. Such payment shall partly or wholly discharge the Annual Installment Lien. Delinquent Annual Installment Amounts may accrue Financing Charges as may be provided in the Finance Agreement. Any additional Financing Charges imposed by the Financing Party pursuant to the Finance Agreement shall increase the Annual Installment Amount and the Annual Installment Lien for the year in which such overdue payments were first due.

- C. The Benefit Assessment Lien shall be reduced annually by the amount of each Annual Installment Lien when each Annual Installment Lien becomes a lien. Each Annual Installment Lien shall be subordinate to all Municipal Liens, whether created by Section 902 of the RPTL or by any other State or local law. No portion of a Secured Amount shall be recovered by the Municipality, EIC, or an assignee upon foreclosure, sale or other disposition of the Benefited Property unless and until all Municipal Liens are fully discharged. Each Annual Installment Lien, however, shall have priority over all Non-Municipal Liens, irrespective of when created, except as otherwise required by law.
- D. Neither the Benefit Assessment Lien nor any Annual Installment Lien shall be extinguished or accelerated in the event of a default or bankruptcy of the Benefited Property Owner. Each Annual Installment Amount shall be considered a charge upon the Benefited Property and shall be collected by EIC, on behalf of the Municipality, at the same time and in the same manner as real property taxes or municipal charges. Each Annual Installment Lien shall remain a lien until paid. Amounts collected in respect of an Annual Installment Lien shall be remitted to EIC, on behalf of the Municipality, or the Financing Party, as may be provided in the Finance Agreement.
- E. EIC shall act as the Municipality's agent in collection of the Annual Installment Amounts. If any Benefited Property Owner fails to pay an Annual Installment Amount, the Financing Party may redeem the Benefited Property by paying the amount of all unpaid Municipal Liens thereon, and thereafter shall have the right to collect any amounts in respect of an Annual Installment Lien by foreclosure or any other remedy available at law. Any foreclosure shall not affect any subsequent Annual Installment Liens.
- F. EIC, on behalf of the Municipality, may sell or assign for consideration any and all Benefit Assessment Liens and Annual Installment Liens to Financing Parties that provide financing to Qualified Properties pursuant to Finance Agreements. The Financing Parties may sell or assign for consideration any and all Benefit Assessment Liens and Annual Installment Liens received from EIC, on behalf of the Municipality, subject to certain conditions provided in the administration agreement between EIC and the Financing Party. The assignee or assignees of such Benefit Assessment Liens and Annual Installment Liens shall have and possess the same powers and rights at law or in equity as the Municipality would have had if the Benefit Assessment Lien and the Annual Installment Liens had not been assigned with regard to the precedence and priority of such lien, the accrual of interest and the fees and expenses of collection.
- §9. Verification and report
- A. EIC, on behalf of the Municipality, shall verify and report on the installation and

performance of Renewable Energy Systems and Energy Efficiency Improvements financed by the Program in such form and manner as the Authority may establish.

§10. Separability. If any clause, sentence, paragraph, section, or part of this local law shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, section, or part thereof involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered.

Section 2. This local law shall take effect upon filing with the Secretary of State.

Legislator Holmquist assumed the chair, so Chairman Knapp could debate. Following debate, Chairman Knapp re-assumed the chair.

WHEREAS, under Subtitle B of Title IV of the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 11371 et seq.), the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development is authorized to make grants to urban counties participating in the Community Development Block Grant Program under the Emergency Solutions Grant Program; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the requirements of such Community Development Block Grant Program, the County has executed cooperation agreements with all the Towns and Villages within the County, which agreements specify that the County, the Towns and Villages will cooperate in undertaking or assisting in undertaking the Community Development Block Grant Program and, specifically urban renewal and publicly assisted housing; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the requirements of such Community Development Block Grant Program, the Onondaga County Executive has appointed a Community Development Steering

Committee to advise on the use of anticipated funds under such Community Development Block Grant Program; and

WHEREAS, such Community Development Steering Committee has solicited public input from all the cooperating Towns and Villages for the purpose of developing the Community Development Block Grant Program for Onondaga County; and

WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development requires the submission of a single application, known as the Consolidated Plan, for the Community Development Block Grant, the Home Investment Partnership Grant, and the Emergency Solutions Grant; and

WHEREAS, such Community Development Steering Committee has agreed upon and made recommendations for the use of anticipated funds from the program through the development of the 2021 Action Plan; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Onondaga County Legislature does memorialize the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development to approve the 2021 Action Plan for a total grant application of \$3,269,823 including \$2,434,058 for the Community Development Block Grant (which includes the 2021 Community Development Block Grant of \$2,334,058 and program income of \$100,000), \$659,207 for the HOME Grant, and \$176,558 for the Emergency Solutions Grant; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the Onondaga County Executive is authorized to file the 2021 Action Plan with the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development for a total of \$3,269,823 and to execute all documents as may be required to implement the intent of this resolution.

LOCAL LAW NO. 6 - 2021

A LOCAL LAW ADOPTING A PILOT YOUTH DEER HUNTING PROGRAM

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY LEGISLATURE OF ONONDAGA COUNTY, NEW YORK AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Title

This Local Law shall be known as "A Local Law Adopting a Pilot Youth Deer Hunting Program."

SECTION 2. Purpose

The purpose of this Local Law is to be consistent with the provisions of Environmental Conservation Law section 11-0935, this Local Law is adopted to authorize the expansion of youth hunting and allow licensed hunters ages 12 or 13 to hunt deer with a crossbow, rifle, shotgun or muzzle-loading firearm when accompanied by a parent, legal guardian, or mentor.

SECTION 3. Authority

This Local Law is adopted under the authority granted by:

- 1. Article IX of the New York State Constitution, § 2[c];
- 2.New York Municipal Home Rule Law, § 10; and
- 3.New York Environmental Conservation Law § 11-0935.

SECTION 4. Definitions

- 1. "Eligible area" means any county within the State of New York that has enacted a local law authorizing participation in a youth hunting pilot program, and has notified the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation of such participation.
- 2. "Hunting license holder" means a person who has successfully completed a hunter education/safety course, and currently holds a valid hunting license issued by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation.
- 3. "Legal guardian" means a person legally responsible for a minor participating in the Pilot Youth Deer Hunting Program who currently holds a valid hunting license issued by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation and has at least three years of prior experience hunting deer as a hunting license holder.
- 4."Mentor" means a person who (a) currently holds a valid hunting license issued by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation, (b) is twenty-one years of age or older, (c) has at least three years of prior experience hunting deer as a hunting license holder, and (d) has been designated in writing by a minor's parent or legal guardian on a form prescribed by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation to serve as a mentor to said minor for purposes of the Pilot Youth Deer Hunting Program.

5."Minor" means a youth twelve or thirteen years of age who currently holds a valid hunting license issued by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation to hunt deer with a crossbow, rifle, shotgun, or muzzle-loading firearm within an eligible area.

- 6. "Parent" means a person who currently holds a valid hunting license issued by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation, has at least three years of prior experience hunting deer as a hunting license holder, and is the parent of the minor participating in the Pilot Youth Deer Hunting Program.
- 7. "Physical control" means that the physical proximity of a minor to a parent, legal guardian or mentor and is such that the parent, legal guardian or mentor is (a) reasonably able to issue verbal directions and instructions, (b) maintain constant visual contact, and (c) otherwise able to provide guidance and supervision to the minor.

SECTION 5. Opt-In Authorization

The youth hunting opportunities authorized by Environmental Conservation Law section 11-0935 shall be applicable within the boundaries of the County of Onondaga upon the adoption of this Local Law by the Onondaga County Legislature for the County of Onondaga, State of New York, and (b) notice provided to the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation of the adoption of this Local Law.

Onondaga County hereby elects to participate in a Pilot Youth Deer Hunting Program to allow minors ages 12 or 13 to hunt deer with a crossbow, rifle, shotgun or muzzle-loading firearm when accompanied by a parent, legal guardian or mentor.

SECTION 6. Eligibility and Requirements

- 1. A minor aged 12 or 13 may hunt deer with a crossbow, rifle, shotgun, or muzzle-loading firearm within the County of Onondaga when accompanied by, and is under the physical control of, a parent, legal guardian or mentor as those terms are defined by Section 4 of this Local Law.
- 2. A minor participating in the Pilot Youth Deer Hunting Program in an eligible area must be in possession of a valid New York State hunting license and valid tags, as appropriate, while afield at all times. The accompanying parent, legal guardian or mentor must also be in possession of a valid New York State hunting license at all times when supervising a minor participating in the Pilot Youth Deer Hunting Program.
- 3. A minor and the accompanying parent, legal guardian or mentor must display either a minimum total of two hundred fifty square inches of solid fluorescent orange or pink or patterned fluorescent orange or pink consisting of no less than fifty percent fluorescent orange or pink material worn above the waist and visible from all directions, or a hat or cap with no less than fifty percent of the exterior consisting of solid fluorescent orange or pink material and visible from all directions.
- 4. A minor aged 12 or 13 participating in the Pilot Youth Deer Hunting Program must remain at ground level at all times when hunting deer with a crossbow, rifle, shotgun, or muzzle-loading firearm.
- 5. A minor participating in the Pilot Youth Deer Hunting Program must remain within the physical proximity of a parent, legal guardian or mentor which means they must be capable of receiving verbal directions and instructions, and be in constant visual contact with the supervising parent, legal guardian or mentor at all times.

6. A minor participating in the Pilot Youth Deer Hunting Program must abide by all other federal, state and local laws, rules and regulations applicable to hunting including, but not limited to, manner of take, bag limits, hunting hours, geographical or general implement restrictions, hunting seasons, tagging, transporting and reporting requirements.

SECTION 7. Filing

In accordance with ECL \S 11-0935.2, a copy of this Local Law shall be filed with the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation. And in accordance with Municipal Home Rule \S 27, a copy shall be filed with the New York State Department of State.

SECTION 8. Severability

Should any provision of this Local Law be declared by the courts to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of this Local Law as a whole or any part thereof other than the part so determined to be unconstitutional or invalid.

SECTION 9. Repeal

All Ordinances, Local Laws and parts thereof inconsistent with this Local Law are hereby repealed.

SECTION 10. Effective Date

This Local Law shall be effective upon its filing with the New York State Secretary of State in accordance with section 27 of the Municipal Home Rule Law.

MEMORIALIZING RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF REQUESTING COMMERCIAL MOTOR VEHICLES TO BE MANDATED TO USE A GLOBAL POSITIONING SYSTEM (GPS) THAT ACCOUNTS FOR LOW BRIDGES AND OVERPASSES

WHEREAS, "commercial motor vehicle" includes tractor-trailers, buses, tall rental trucks used for hauling, construction trucks, and any other vehicle used for commercial purposes; and

WHEREAS, New York State averages 220 bridge strikes per year due to over-height commercial vehicles that result in injuries to drivers, other motorists, costly repairs to bridges, traffic disruptions, and harm to highway infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, New York State spends around \$15 million per year to repair bridge strikes; and

WHEREAS, according to the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration, GPS devices designed for commercial-use provides important information to drivers that they would not receive if using a non-commercial GPS device, such as information on low bridges and overpasses; and

WHEREAS, in 2018, New York State issued guidelines urging insurers to encourage commercial auto policy-holders to utilize GPS systems that specifically warn truck drivers and bus operators of height restrictions on New York roads; and

WHEREAS, New York State has spent \$4.3 million to prevent vehicles from striking low-bridges around New York City by installing infrared beam systems that identify an over-height vehicle on a roadway with a low bridge, and then posts an alert message for the driver on an electronic sign along the roadway, warning them to leave before encountering the hazard; and

WHEREAS, at some locations, drivers of over-height vehicles have stated that the warning from the infrared system comes too late to offer sufficient time to exit a highway; and

WHEREAS, the Trucking Association of New York stated that GPS devices designed for commercial-use is preferrable because some drivers are from out-of-state, and thus are unfamiliar with New York roads and where the infrared systems may be located; and

WHEREAS, utilizing GPS devices designed for commerical-use is more financially responsible for New York State than expending millions of dollars on infrared systems only to cover a few bridges in the New York City metro-area; and

WHEREAS, GPS devices designed for commercial-use offer a better warning for the driver, ensures every bridge can be accounted for, and will better improve road safety across New York to protect highway infrastructure; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that this Onondaga County Legislature hereby requests that the New York State Legislature mandate the use of commercial global positioning systems on commercial motor vehicles for the safety of motorists, New York State roadways, and to protect highway infrastructure; and, be it further

WHEREAS, in order to help OCIDA promote and stimulate economic development in Onondaga County, this Legislature seeks to support these efforts by agreeing to loan OCIDA funds to help to pay for its program incentives, projects, including asset development, and work related improvements, along with, industrial and commercial marketability; now, therefore be it

WHEREAS, the Onondaga County Department of Social Services – Economic Security is the appropriate agency to assess individual and family needs in the City, that are intended to be addressed by the funding received by the City from the U.S. Department of the Treasury, American Rescue Plan Act funds for Emergency Rental Assistance Programs; and

The Prosecution's failure or inability to comply with these automatic and expedited discovery demands may have the potential to have the charges dismissed; and

WHEREAS, the Discovery Reform Law also mandates that the Onondaga County District Attorney's Office rely heavily on its legal and administrative staff, the Onondaga County Sheriff's Office, City of Syracuse Police Department and all local police agencies, 911 Emergency Department, Medical Examiner's Office, and local area hospitals, and imposed exorbitant budgetary demands on the Onondaga County District Attorney's Office, City of Syracuse Police Department and all local police agencies, along with the local agencies they works with, by imposing increased personnel, administrative, and technical costs; and

WHEREAS, the New York State Division of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS) has recognized these increased costs in implementing the Discovery Reform Law and has provided funding to the County to help with expenses related to the implementation of discovery and bail reforms; and

WHEREAS, the County of Onondaga agreed to receive grant monies, assign staff, and advance benefits in performance of the grant; and now seeks to reimburse the City of Syracuse through the Criminal Justice Discovery Reform Grant funding for the City of Syracuse's expenses totaling \$265,695, incurred in complying with the Discovery Reform Law, including an allocation for administrative expenses; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the County Executive is hereby authorized to enter into an agreement with the City of Syracuse to reimburse them with grant monies received in the amount of \$265,695, for the costs associated with implementing the Discovery Reform Law; and, be it further

ADOPTING THE ANNUAL BUDGET FOR THE COUNTY OF ONONDAGA FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2022, AND ENDING DECEMBER 31, 2022 AND AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE TO ENTER INTO CONTRACTS WITH OTHER GOVERNMENTAL UNITS IN WHICH APPROPRIATIONS AND REVENUES ARE APPROVED BY ADOPTION OF THE 2022 BUDGET

WHEREAS, the Executive Budget for the year 2022 (on file with the Clerk of the Legislature) including the Capital Improvement Plan, the County Executive's Budget Message, and proposed local laws and resolutions to implement the Executive Budget having been duly presented to this Legislature by the County Executive; and

WHEREAS, the Ways and Means Committee of the Onondaga County Legislature has duly reviewed such Executive Budget, the Capital Improvement Plan and the Budget Message, each as submitted to the County Legislature by the County Executive; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 97-2021, a Public Hearing as required by Article VI of the Charter, was duly held on October 21, 2021, upon such Executive Budget, the Capital Improvement Plan and the Budget Message as submitted by the County Executive, upon due notice according to law, and at such time all persons desiring to be heard were heard; and

WHEREAS, the total Budget of \$1,386,244,471 (as amended by the Ways and Means Report) includes the sum of \$9,872,000 which amount is the contribution from the General Fund for the Onondaga Community College Budget for the fiscal year ending August 31, 2022, as adopted by Resolution No. 67-2021. From this total Budget amount can be deducted \$1,204,669,241 estimated revenues and refunds and the sum of \$25,320,562 representing appropriated prior year cash surplus, leaving a net budget subject to tax levy for County purposes of \$156,254,668. Of this amount \$9,872,000 represents the levy to support the Community College and \$146,382,668 for all other purposes; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the County Executive's 2022 Budget (on file with the Clerk of this Legislature) be amended, altered, and revised by the Report of the Ways and Means Committee, as set forth following the final Resolved Clause of this resolution; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the County Executive's 2022 Executive Budget, as amended, altered and revised by the first Resolved Clause hereinabove, (which budget is attached hereto, follows and is made a part hereof) be and the same hereby is approved and adopted as the Annual County Budget for the fiscal year beginning January 1, 2022, for the County of Onondaga, and that the several amounts set forth and specified herein be and they hereby are appropriated for the purpose therein enumerated; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that there be levied, assessed and collected upon the taxable property of the County of Onondaga the further sum of \$146,382,668 for general County purposes other than the Onondaga Community College; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the Clerk of the Legislature is hereby directed to apportion the various amounts according to law upon the respective abstracts for the several towns and the City of Syracuse; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the amounts appropriated for the fiscal year 2022 in each administrative unit using the expense code 641010-Regular Employee Salaries and Wages, and the number of regular positions authorized by this Legislature for such fiscal year be and they hereby are appropriated and authorized as follows:

- 1. That the position in each administrative unit set forth by the title listed and the corresponding number of such position allocated to such title and listed under the column "2022 Executive Positions" be authorized as the roster of regular positions for such unit, and the Salary Plan shall be amended to reflect the titles of positions created, abolished, reclassified or reallocated on the roster of regular positions.
- 2. That the rate of pay for each such position shall be determined by the salary grade set forth for each such position in the column adjacent to the position title in accordance with the appropriate County Salary Plan Grades Schedule printed in this Budget, or if applicable, by such other salary rate as is authorized by this Legislature in the County Salary Plan as amended and herein set forth for such position.
- 3. That the rate of pay to the individual filling each such position be determined in accordance with the rules of said Salary Plan, or other applicable resolution of this Legislature, which pay rate shall include the regular compensation rate, including maintenance, if any, and where applicable premium compensation such as longevity payments, education premium in grade, shift differential or any premium payments, exclusive of overtime premium, to which such individual may be entitled by resolution of this Legislature.
- 4. That the amount of money appropriated for the roster of regular positions in each such administrative unit be in the amount shown for "Regular Employees Salaries and Wages" in the column entitled "2022 Executive Positions" which amount is determined as follows: The "Total Annual Salaries and Wages" set forth in the column entitled "2022 Executive Positions", which is the sum of (1) annual salaries recommended for 2022 set forth for the incumbents listed in the roster of regular positions maintained by the Department of Personnel, (2) annual salaries recommended for 2022 for funded vacant positions in such roster computed at the starting salary amount, and (3) the amount recommended for any purpose set forth in the column entitled "2022 Executive Positions".

RESOLUTION NO. 113

PROVIDING FOR VARIOUS PERSONNEL CHANGES RELATED TO THE ADOPTION OF THE 2022 COUNTY BUDGET AND AMENDING THE ONONDAGA COUNTY SALARY PLAN

WHEREAS, to effectuate the 2022 County Budget, it is necessary to provide for various changes in personnel, and the personnel changes authorized herein are complementary to the roster of positions authorized within the 2022 County Budget, having been approved by the Commissioner of Personnel, Chief Fiscal Officer, County Executive and the Ways & Means Committee of the County Legislature; and

WHEREAS, to achieve greater levels of economy and efficiency, the County has reorganized several of its administrative units, changing the way in which services are delivered and administered and investing in new enterprise technologies and structures, and, as part of such reorganization, by a series of resolutions adopted since 2013, a number of persons, functions, and administrative duties have been transferred among various administrative units, and it is now necessary to provide for additional personnel changes and to realign available human resources in connection with service delivery to the County's departments; and

WHEREAS, for management confidential salaries, it is necessary to implement an increase in salary for management confidential positions in order to retain and recruit highly skilled professionals, maintain the County's high level of services to its citizens, and provide equitable promotional opportunities to employees; and

WHEREAS, Onondaga County positions requiring a law degree no longer offer competitive salaries when compared with similar private sector positions within the county and state, and in order to reestablish a competitive balance, and recruit and retain experienced, competent legal professionals an increase in salaries of positions requiring a law degree is necessary to allow County departments to reestablish competitive salaries; and

WHEREAS, certain hourly and temporary positions in Onondaga County have historically been paid at a rate at least equal to the New York State minimum wage, and it is necessary to amend the salary plan to provide for persons employed in such positions to be paid at an amount equal to the New York State minimum wage that will be effective after December 31, 2021, as provided within Labor Law Section 652, as amended; and

RESOLVED, that the Onondaga County Salary Plan be further amended to provide for the changes in the hourly rates and daily rates for the several titles affected by the New York State minimum wage increase and that salary adjustments for the incumbents within such titles be authorized; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that this Onondaga County Legislature hereby authorizes the transfer of the functions, positions and employees, effective January 1, 2022, where such transfers are made pursuant to Section 70.2 of New York State Civil Service Law:

Transfer from within the Personnel Department (Admin Unit 7100), L100435 Personnel Officer at Grade 31 to the Water Environment Protection Department (Admin Unit 3330); and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the Salary and Benefit Schedule attached hereto and made a part hereof as Appendix A, entitled, "2022 Management Confidential Salary Schedule" shall be applicable to all regular full time employees and regular part time employees (on a pro rata basis), who are not represented by a bargaining unit through a recognized labor organization and are working in management confidential titles (collectively, "management confidential employees"); and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the Onondaga County Salary Plan is hereby amended with respect to management confidential employees such that the salary schedule set forth in Appendix A shall take effect at the start of the first full pay period commencing after January 1, 2022; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the Onondaga County Salary Plan for certain management confidential titles requiring a legal degree attached hereto and made a part hereof as Appendix B, entitled "Management Confidential – Attorney Salary Schedule" shall be applicable to all regular full time employees and regular part time employees (on a pro rata basis), who are not represented by a bargaining unit through a recognized labor organization and are working in management confidential attorney titles; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the Onondaga County Salary Plan is hereby amended such that the salary schedule set forth in Appendix B shall take effect at the start of the first full pay period commencing after, effective January 1, 2022 for the titles as set out more fully in Attachment B; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that effective at the start of the first full pay period commencing after January 1, 2022, each management confidential employee shall be slotted into Appendix A at the employee's current step and at the appropriate grade for such employee's title; thereafter, each such employee shall advance one lateral step within the same grade effective with the beginning of the first full payroll period after the employee's anniversary date in title, and each such employee shall receive compensation at the rate established in Appendix A for said grade and step; and, be it further

RESOLUTION NO. 116

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING AN AMENDED SCHEDULE OF SEWER RENTS FOR THE ONONDAGA COUNTY SANITARY DISTRICT

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 563-1978 and pursuant to the Onondaga County Administrative Code Section 11.79, this County Legislature established and imposed a schedule of sewer rents for the Onondaga County Sanitary District ("District"), and such schedule imposed sewer rents upon property owners within the District on the basis of a "unit", using an estimate of 146,000 gallons per year for each such unit; and

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 151-2020, this County Legislature provided for a new schedule of sewer rents, redefining a unit using an estimate of 120,000 gallons per year for each such unit; and WHEREAS, by adopting this resolution, such unit will be redefined using an estimate of 115,000 gallons per year for each such unit, and the schedule of proposed sewer rents provided herein will become effective on and after January 1, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the proposed schedule was filed with the Clerk of the County Legislature and with the clerks of the various towns, villages and the City of Syracuse, all within or partly within the District wherein such proposed sewer rents will be effective; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Onondaga County Administrative Code, the Commissioner of Water Environment Protection held a hearing on September 30, 2021 to consider the modification of sewer rents and has prepared and submitted a Report dated September 30, 2021, as approved by the County Executive and filed with the Clerk of the Onondaga County Legislature, recommending modification to the existing schedule of sewer rents; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held by this Onondaga County Legislature on October 26, 2021; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that this Onondaga County Legislature hereby modifies sewer rents for the District to be allocated on the basis of "units" as defined in the following schedule, where one unit is based on the estimate of 115,000 gallons to be used per year for each such unit:

- a. Single family structure, mobile home, townhouse, condominium one unit each.
- b. All other multi-family residential structures three-fourths unit per family.
- c. Mixed use properties having both residential and commercial use three-fourths unit per family plus 1 unit assigned for the total commercial space, or, alternatively, in the event that the actual water usage exceeds the calculation of gallons per unit within this subsection (c) for the residential and commercial portions of the property, the number of units to be assigned to such property shall be based on water bills, as follows:
- 1. Up to 115,000 gallons per year one unit;
- 2. One unit and fraction thereof for each 115,000 gallons per year
- d. Commercial, industrial and institutional properties units to be assigned based on water bills, or, where property is metered, or sufficient verification exists of wastewater discharged, as follows:
- Up to 115,000 gallons per year one unit;
- 2. One unit and fraction thereof for each 115,000 gallons per year

and, be it further

RESOLVED, that this Legislature does hereby establish and impose the above schedule of sewer rents to be effective January 1, 2022, and said sewer rents shall be levied, collected and enforced from the several lots and parcels of land within the District served by the sewer system for use of the same, in the same manner and at the same time as other County charges, and shall constitute a lien pursuant to law upon the real properties served by the sewer system; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the Clerk of the Onondaga County Legislature hereby is directed to record a certified copy of this Resolution in the Office of the County Clerk of Onondaga County and thereafter to publish this Resolution in the official newspaper of the County at least once, where publication shall be at least thirty (30) days before the effective date hereof.

LOCAL LAW NO. 7 - 2021

A LOCAL LAW AUTHORIZING A REVOLVING LOAN FUND FOR PROGRAMS OF EXTERNAL REPAIRS AND IMPROVEMENTS TO BE MADE ON RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY WITHIN ONONDAGA COUNTY

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY LEGISLATURE OF ONONDAGA COUNTY AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Purpose/Intent.

Well-kept and visually appealing properties greatly benefit county residents as a whole, in that such properties enhance the value of surrounding properties, promote development and investment in the communities within which such properties are situated, and contribute to developing civic responsibility and growth within neighborhoods. This Legislature has previously determined and continues to find it to be a County purpose to assist residential and commercial property owners within Onondaga County in making external repairs or improvements to their properties for the protection and enhancement of the physical and visual environment and protection of the property located within the County. Such County-sponsored programs advance the County's goals of promoting community development and economic development to benefit its residents and taxpayers.

Section 2. Establishment.

Programs through which external repairs and improvements may be performed on residential properties within Onondaga County may also include a Revolving Loan Fund to provide financial assistance in the form of loans to property owners within Onondaga County who occupy the property as a primary residence. Any such programs shall be subject to annual appropriations made within the Onondaga County Budget. The County may assist property owners in making such repairs or improvements, provided that there is a documented public benefit to such repairs or improvements.

Section 3. SEQR.

Documentation shall be retained showing that activities undertaken in connection with this local law are in compliance with the State Environmental Quality Review Act and have been subjected to the appropriate programmatic reviews.

Section 4. Any inconsistent local law hereby is amended to conform to the provisions of this local law.

 $Section \ 5. \qquad This \ local \ law \ shall \ take \ effect \ upon \ filing \ in \ accordance \ with \ the \ Municipal \ Home \ Rule \ Law.$

RESOLVED, that the Onondaga County Legislature hereby calls for the public hearing to be held before the Onondaga County Legislature on November 10, 2021 at 6:00 PM in the Legislative Chambers, 401 Montgomery Street, Room 407 of the Court House, Syracuse, New York relative to the local law proposed by the Reapportionment Commission to reapportion the Onondaga County Legislature by amending Article II, Section 206 of the Onondaga County Charter, with notice of such hearing to be afforded pursuant to applicable provisions of the New York State Open Meetings Law.

LOCAL LAW NO. - 2021

A LOCAL LAW TO REAPPORTION THE ONONDAGA COUNTY LEGISLATURE BY AMENDING ARTICLE II, SECTION 206 OF THE ONONDAGA COUNTY CHARTER

BE IT ENACTED BY THE ONONDAGA COUNTY LEGISLATURE OF THE COUNTY OF ONONDAGA, NEW YORK, AS FOLLOWS:

 $\underline{Section\ 1}$. Article II, Section 206 of the Onondaga County Charter is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 206. Districts. For the purpose of electing County Legislators, Onondaga County shall be divided into seventeen (17) districts. One County Legislator shall be elected to the County Legislature of Onondaga County from each of said districts. Eleven (11) of these districts shall be composed of territory within the County of Onondaga totally outside the City of Syracuse; Three (3) of these districts shall be composed of territory totally within the City of Syracuse; Three (3) of these districts shall be composed of territory both outside the City of Syracuse and territory within the City of Syracuse. All references to towns apply to the territory wholly contained in each of the towns of Onondaga County bounded as of November 1, 2021.

The eleven (11) districts within the County of Onondaga composed of territory totally outside of the City of Syracuse are described as follows:

FIRST LEGISLATIVE DISTRICT

All of the Town of Lysander, and a portion of the Town of Van Buren bounded by a line described as follows: BEGINNING at a point at the intersection of the northern town line of the Town of Van Buren and the southern town line of the Town of Lysander and the western village line of the Village of Baldwinsville, which is coincident with the centerline of the Seneca River; thence following the Village of Baldwinsville village line generally southerly, easterly, and northerly to its intersection with the centerline of Syracuse Street; thence southerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Maple Road; thence southerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Van Buren Road; thence southerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of the eastbound lane of Village Boulevard; thence easterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Delwood Drive; thence northwesterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of the southbound lane of Village Boulevard North; thence northeasterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of the southbound lane of Village Boulevard North; thence northeasterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline to its intersection with the centerline of State Fair Boulevard; thence southeasterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of State Fair Boulevard; thence

SECOND LEGISLATIVE DISTRICT

Portions of the towns of Clay and Salina bounded by a line described as follows: BEGINNING at a point of intersection of the western town line of the Town of Clay and the eastern town line of the Town of Lysander with the centerlines of the Oneida River, the Oswego River, and the Seneca River; thence southerly along said town line, which is coincident with the centerline of the Seneca River, to its intersection with the westerly elongation of Bel Harbor Drive; thence easterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Oswego Road; thence southerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Laurel Lane; thence easterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Eagles Pointe Circle; thence easterly, southerly, and westerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Laurel Lane; thence southerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of the westbound lane of John Glenn Boulevard; thence westerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Oswego Road; thence southerly along said centerline to its intersection with the Village of Liverpool village line; thence easterly and southerly along said village line to its intersection with the centerline of the CSX rail line, just east of Cleveland Street; thence northerly along said rail line to its intersection with the southern Town of Clay and northern Town of Salina town lines; thence easterly along said town line to its intersection with the centerline of Henry Clay Boulevard; thence northerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of West Taft Road; thence northeasterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Bear Road; thence northeasterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Liffey Lane; thence westerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Donegal Way; thence northwesterly along said centerline to its intersection with the Powerline Right-of-Way; thence northeasterly along said Right-of-Way to the southern property line of Norstar Apartments; thence westerly along said southern property line and elongation of Norstar Apartments to its intersection with the centerline of Henry Clay Boulevard; thence northerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Wetzel Road; thence westerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Morgan Road; thence northerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of the westbound lane of Fairway Drive North; thence westerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Fairway Drive East; thence westerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Molson Way; thence northerly and westerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Fairway Drive East; thence westerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Jaguar Path; thence northerly and westerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Fairway Drive East; thence northwesterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Cottonwood Court; thence northerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Pisces Circle; thence northerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Steelhead Drive; thence northerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Streamwood Drive; thence northerly and westerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Soule Road; thence northerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Route 31; thence easterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Henry Clay Boulevard; thence northerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Oak Orchard Road; thence westerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Morgan Road; thence northerly along said centerline to its intersection with the Town of Clay northern town line, which is coincident with the centerline of the Oneida River; thence westerly, northerly, and southerly along the northern town line of the Town of Clay to the point of beginning.

THIRD LEGISLATIVE DISTRICT

Portions of the Town of Cicero bounded by a line described as follows: BEGINNING at a point at the intersection of the western town line of the Town of Cicero and the eastern town line of the Town of

Clay and the centerline of the Oneida River; thence generally southerly and easterly along said town line to its intersection with the northern village line of the Village of North Syracuse; thence easterly and southerly along said village line to its intersection with the northbound centerline of Interstate 481, said intersection being east of South Bay Road; thence easterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Thompson Road; thence southerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of General Irwin Boulevard; thence southerly along said centerline to its intersection with the southern town line of the Town of Cicero and the northern town line of the Town of DeWitt; thence following said town line of the Town of Cicero generally easterly then northwesterly to the point of beginning.

FOURTH LEGISLATIVE DISTRICT

<u>Section 2</u>. Separability. If any section, part or provision of this local law, including without limitation any part or provision relating to any district described herein, shall be adjudged invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall: (1) be confined in its operation to the section, part or provision of this local law or the district or districts directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered, (2) not affect or impair the validity of the remaining sections, parts, provisions or districts, and (3) not affect or impair the validity of the remaining apportionment or districting provided for in this local law. The Onondaga County Legislature hereby declares that it would have enacted this local law of such remaining parts, provisions or districts, had the invalidity of such part, provision or district been apparent at the time of such enactment.

<u>Section 3</u>. Construction. This local law shall be liberally construed to effectuate the purposes thereof and to apportion and district this county in compliance with the rulings of the United States Supreme Court and New York State Municipal Home Rule Law Section 34(4).

It is intended that this local law and the districts described herein completely encompass all the area within the county. It is also intended that such districts apportioned on the basis of 2020 citizen population contain all the citizens resident in this county. It is further intended that the apportionment and districting provided for in this local law result in the creation of districts containing substantially equal citizen population. It is also intended that no district shall include any of the area included within the description of any other district.

Section 4. This reapportionment plan is adopted and is subject to a permissive referendum pursuant to the provisions of Onondaga County Charter Section 207 and Onondaga County Administrative Code Section 2.17. A petition signed, authenticated and filed by qualified electors of the County, registered to vote therein at the last preceding general election, in number equal to at least 10 per centum of the total number of votes cast for governor at the last gubernatorial election in the County, as provided in subdivision one of Section 24 of the Municipal Home Rule Law, within 45 days of adoption of this local law, shall be sufficient to require the submission of a proposition for the approval of such local law at a referendum in accordance with such subdivision. Petition and referendum procedures, including criteria for establishing or challenging the validity of such petition, shall be in accordance with subdivision one of Section 24 of the Municipal Home Rule Law.

Section 5. This local law shall become effective upon adoption and filing with the New York State Secretary of State. Provided, however, that if within 45 days after its adoption there be filed with the Clerk of the County Legislature a petition protesting against such local law, signed and authenticated in the manner set forth in subdivision one of Section 24 of the Municipal Home Rule Law by qualified electors of the County, registered to vote therein at the last preceding general election, in number equal to at least 10 per centum of the total number of votes cast for governor at the last gubernatorial election in the County, then such local law shall not take effect until approved by the affirmative vote of a majority of the qualified electors of the County voting on a proposition for its approval.

Mrs. Ervin moved to table Local Law A for 30 days. Seconded by Mr. Ryan.

RESOLVED, that a record of such transfers and adjustments be prepared by the Finance Department Division of Management and Budget, and such record of transfers be issued to the Clerk of the County Legislature, with a copy to the members of the Ways and Means Committee, following the closure of the County's 2021 financial records; and, be it further

RESOLUTION NO. 167

AUTHORIZING AN AGREEMENT WITH THE CITY OF SYRACUSE RELATING TO THE USE OF THE CITY FUEL FACILITY AT THE CITY'S DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS BY ONONDAGA COUNTY VEHICLES

WHEREAS, the City of Syracuse operates a Fuel Facility at the City's Department of Public Works, and the County would like to enter into an agreement with the City to be permitted to use such facility for filling various work-related vehicles; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioner of Public Works has determined that the City Fuel Facility is capable of handling the additional fuel required to carry out the terms of the agreement authorized herein, and the City Common Council has authorized such agreement on October 12, 2021, Ordinance No. 625-2021; and

WHEREAS, the County currently uses the City's Fuel Facility under an agreement authorized by Resolution No. 59-2019, and it is necessary to authorize a renewal of such agreement; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the County Executive is authorized to execute an agreement with the City of Syracuse regarding the use of the City of Syracuse Public Works Fuel Facility to fuel various vehicles used by the County of Onondaga; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that under such agreement, continuing the same terms and conditions, fuel will be provided to approximately 310 cars and pick-up trucks owned by the County of Onondaga and/or used by County of Onondaga officers and employees in the course of their employment responsibilities, and, further, that the County shall pay to the City all actual costs associated with the County's use of the Fuel Facility, including: (1) all the costs of vehicle gas keys and personnel identification numbers required by said County vehicles; (2) costs necessary for computer accessibility, including but not limited to a phone modem; (3) the cost of fuel obtained at the Fuel Facility to be used in County vehicles, plus an administrative fee of \$.06 for each gallon obtained at the Fuel Facility to be used in County vehicles; (4) with the charge for keys being based on actual cost to the City to be paid on an "as incurred basis"; and (5) an administrative fee of five percent (5%) of the costs associated with vehicle gas keys and personnel identification numbers issued to the County; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the costs for the fuel obtained at the Fuel Facility and the administrative charge added to each gallon is to be paid by the County to the City on a monthly basis and that the remaining charges, including the various identification numbers and gas keys and administrative charges therefor, are to be paid by the County to the City as such costs are incurred by the City; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that in the event that the County desires to increase the number of County vehicles obtaining fuel under this agreement, such number may be increased as agreed upon by the parties,

provided, however, that the City verifies that it has the capability to accommodate the desired increase; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that during the term of this agreement, any updates or improvements to the City's Fuel Facility and related systems shall be a shared cost between the City and the County in an amount proportionate to the percentage of fuel used by each party; provided, however, that the City shall notify and get approval of the County prior to commencement of such improvements, and that further the County shall be solely responsible for the costs of updates or changes in programming which are done for the convenience of the County; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the initial term of the agreement shall be for one year and may be renewed for two additional one-year periods, and that further, notwithstanding the term of the agreement, either the City or County may terminate this agreement at any time upon thirty (30) days written notice to the other party, provided that all costs and expenses due or accruing under such agreement shall be promptly paid on or prior to the date of termination.

LOCAL LAW NO. ___ - 2021

A LOCAL LAW AMENDING ARTICLE II OF THE ONONDAGA COUNTY ADMINISTRATIVE CODE SECTION 2.17 WITH RESPECT TO REAPPORTIONMENT

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY LEGISLATURE OF ONONDAGA COUNTY AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Administrative Code is hereby amended as follows:

Section 2.17. REAPPORTIONMENT.

To comply with the timeline in Section 207 of the Onondaga County Charter, at least thirty days prior to the earliest date of circulation of designating petitions for the primary election occurring 12 months following publication of the results of each federal decennial census of the County, the County Legislature shall prepare and approve a plan of reapportionment reflecting the number and geographic boundaries of the various districts from which its subsequent membership shall be elected. Each such plan shall be based upon the distribution of population throughout the County. It shall conform to applicable guidelines and rules relating to apportionment and, within such structures, provide for districts as nearly compatible with local governmental lines within the County as shall then be practicable. A reapportionment commission shall be created and appointed pursuant to Section 207 of the Onondaga County Charter as amended.

However, upon each and every reapportionment conducted pursuant to Onondaga County Administrative Code Section 2.17, subsequent to September 1, 2010, the number of legislators shall be reduced to seventeen, and the number of districts shall be reduced to seventeen. One legislator shall be elected from each of said seventeen districts, and district boundaries shall be revised to be consistent therewith.

In the event that the local law providing for such reapportionment shall be placed on the ballot pursuant to referendum, the number of legislators shall not be reduced unless and until said local law is approved by the voters.

Section 2. Construction.

Any previously enacted resolutions or local laws relating to the reapportionment procedures in Onondaga County are hereby amended to be consistent with this local law. Except as specifically amended herein, the Onondaga County Charter and Administrative Code remain in full force and effect

Section 3. Severability.

In the event that any provision contained herein should be found by a judge to be improper, illegal, and/or void, it is the intent of this Legislature to sever such provisions from this local law and to revive and restore the relevant provisions of the Charter and Administrative Code to the status quo ante.

Section 4. Effective Date.

This local law shall take effect upon filing in accordance with the Municipal Home Rule Law.

LOCAL LAW NO. ___ - 2021

A LOCAL LAW TO REAPPORTION THE ONONDAGA COUNTY LEGISLATURE BY AMENDING ARTICLE II, SECTION 206 OF THE ONONDAGA COUNTY CHARTER

BE IT ENACTED BY THE ONONDAGA COUNTY LEGISLATURE OF THE COUNTY OF ONONDAGA, NEW YORK, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Article II, Section 206 of the Onondaga County Charter is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 206. DISTRICTS.

For the purpose of electing County Legislators, Onondaga County shall be divided into seventeen (17) districts. One County Legislator shall be elected to the County Legislature of Onondaga County from each of said districts. Eleven (11) of these districts shall be composed of territory within the County of Onondaga totally outside the City of Syracuse; Five (5) of these districts shall be composed of territory totally within the City of Syracuse; One (1) of these districts shall be composed of territory both outside the City of Syracuse and territory within the City of Syracuse. All references to towns apply to the territory wholly contained in each of the towns of Onondaga County bounded as of November 1, 2021.

The eleven (11) districts within the County of Onondaga composed of territory totally outside of the City of Syracuse are described as follows:

FIRST LEGISLATIVE DISTRICT

All of the Town of Van Buren and a portion of the Town of Lysander bounded by a line described as follows: BEGINNING at a point at northwest corner of the Town of Lysander; thence generally easterly and southerly along the northern town line of the Town of Lysander to its intersection with the easterly elongation of the centerline of an unnamed creek, said creek crossing River Road approximately 700' south of the intersection of River Road and Greenleaf Drive; thence westerly along said elongation and creek centerline to its intersection with River Road; thence southerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Potter Road; thence westerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of North Entry Road; thence southerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Braewood Drive; thence northeasterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of

Carpenter Road; thence southeasterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of the southbound lane of Willett Parkway; thence southwesterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Route 31; thence westerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Aspen Springs Drive; thence southerly along said centerline to its intersection with the village line of the Village of Baldwinsville; thence following said village line generally easterly, southerly and westerly to its intersection with the centerline of Cold Springs Road; thence southeasterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Bendigo Drive; thence southerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Cortina Road; thence southeasterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Killoe Road; thence easterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Dunderry Heights; thence northerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Cold Springs Road; thence southeasterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of North Hayes Road; thence southwesterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of an unnamed creek, said intersection being approximately 700' north of the intersection of North Hayes Road and Perryville Road; thence westerly along said creek centerline to its intersection with the southern town line of the Town of Lysander and the northern town line of the Town of Van Buren, said town lines also being the centerline of the Seneca River; thence following said town line of the Town of Lysander generally westerly then northerly to the point of beginning.

SECOND LEGISLATIVE DISTRICT

Portions of the towns of Clay and Lysander bounded by a line described as follows: BEGINNING at a point of intersection of the western town line of the Town of Clay and the eastern town line of the Town of Lysander with the centerlines of the Oneida River, the Oswego River, and the Seneca River; thence northerly along said town line of the Town of Lysander to its intersection with the easterly elongation of the centerline of an unnamed creek, said creek crossing River Road approximately 700' south of the intersection of River Road and Greenleaf Drive; thence westerly along said elongation and creek centerline to its intersection with River Road; thence southerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Glacier Ridge Road; thence westerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Potter Road; thence westerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of North Entry Road; thence southerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Braewood Drive; thence northeasterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Carpenter Road; thence southeasterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of the southbound lane of Willett Parkway; thence southwesterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Route 31; thence westerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Aspen Springs Drive; thence southerly along said centerline to its intersection with the village line of the Village of Baldwinsville; thence following said village line generally southerly to its intersection with the centerline of Cold Springs Road; thence southeasterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Bendigo Drive; thence southerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Cortina Road; thence southeasterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Killoe Road; thence easterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Dunderry Heights; thence northerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Cold Springs Road; thence southeasterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of North Hayes Road; thence southwesterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of an unnamed creek, said intersection being approximately 700' north of the intersection of North Hayes Road and Perryville Road; thence westerly along said creek centerline to its intersection with the southern town line of the Town of Lysander and the northern town line of the Town of Van Buren, said town lines also being the centerline of the Seneca River; thence following said town line of the Town of Lysander generally easterly and northerly to its intersection with a westerly elongation of the centerline of Wetzel Road; thence easterly along said elongation and centerline of Wetzel Road to its intersection with the centerline of Morgan Road; thence northerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of the southbound lane of Route 481; thence northwesterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Route 31; thence easterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Henry Clay Boulevard; thence northerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Oak Orchard Road; thence westerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Morgan Road; thence northerly along said centerline to its intersection with the northern town line of the Town of Clay, said town line also being the centerline of the Oneida River; thence following the town line of the Town of Clay generally northwesterly and southwesterly to the point of beginning.

THIRD LEGISLATIVE DISTRICT

Portions of the towns of Cicero and Manlius bounded by a line described as follows: BEGINNING at a point at the intersection of the western town line of the Town of Cicero and the eastern town line of the Town of Clay and the centerline of the Oneida River; thence generally southerly and easterly along said town line of the Town of Clay to its intersection with the centerline of Route 31; thence easterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of the northbound lane of Interstate 81; thence southerly along said centerline to its intersection with a westerly elongation of the centerline of Gillette Road; thence southeasterly along said elongation and centerline of Gillette Road to its intersection with the centerline of South Bay Road; thence southwesterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of East Pine Grove Road; thence easterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Thompson Road; thence easterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of the northbound lane of Northern Boulevard; thence southerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of the northbound lane of Interstate 481; thence southeasterly along said centerline to its intersection with the northern town line of the Town of DeWitt and the southern town line of the Town of Cicero; thence following said town line of the town of DeWitt generally easterly and southerly to its intersection with the centerline of Manlius Center Road; thence easterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Fremont Road; thence northerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of the southernmost track of the CSX rail line; thence easterly along said rail line to its intersection with the western village line of the Village of Minoa; thence following said village line generally southerly, easterly, and northerly to its intersection with the centerline of Schepps Corners Road; thence northerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Kirkville Road; thence easterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of North Manlius Road; thence northeasterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of the eastbound lane of the New York State Thruway; thence easterly along said centerline to its intersection with the eastern town line of the Town of Manlius; thence following said town line generally northerly to its intersection with the town line of the Town of Cicero; thence following said town line of the Town of Cicero generally northerly and northwesterly to the point of beginning.

FOURTH LEGISLATIVE DISTRICT

Portions of the town Salina bounded by a line described as follows: BEGINNING at a point at the intersection the town lines of the towns of Salina, Clay, and Lysander; thence following said town line of the Town of Salina generally southwesterly, southeasterly, and easterly to its intersection with the centerline of Teall Avenue; thence northerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of the westbound lane of Court Street; thence easterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of the westbound lane of Route 298; thence easterly along said centerline to its intersection with the eastern town line of the Town of Salina; thence following said town line generally northerly and westerly to its intersection with the centerline of the southbound lane of Interstate Route 81; thence southwesterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of the northbound lane of Brewerton Road;

Section 2. Separability.

If any section, part or provision of this local law, including without limitation any part or provision relating to any district described herein, shall be adjudged invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall: (1) be confined in its operation to the section, part or provision of this local law or the district or districts directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered, (2) not affect or impair the validity of the remaining sections, parts, provisions or districts, and (3) not affect or impair the validity of the remaining apportionment or districting provided for in this local law. The Onondaga County Legislature hereby declares that it would have enacted this local law of such remaining parts, provisions or districts, had the invalidity of such part, provision or district been apparent at the time of such enactment.

Section 3. Construction.

This local law shall be liberally construed to effectuate the purposes thereof and to apportion and district this county in compliance with the rulings of the United States Supreme Court and New York State Municipal Home Rule Law Section 34(4).

It is intended that this local law and the districts described herein completely encompass all the area within the county. It is also intended that such districts apportioned on the basis of 2020 citizen

population contain all the citizens' resident in this county. It is further intended that the apportionment and districting provided for in this local law result in the creation of districts containing substantially equal citizen population. It is also intended that no district shall include any of the area included within the description of any other district.

Section 4. Permissive Referendum.

This reapportionment plan is adopted and is subject to a permissive referendum pursuant to the provisions of Onondaga County Charter Section 207 and Onondaga County Administrative Code Section 2.17. A petition signed, authenticated and filed by qualified electors of the County, registered to vote therein at the last preceding general election, in number equal to at least 10 per centum of the total number of votes cast for governor at the last gubernatorial election in the County, as provided in subdivision one of Section 24 of the Municipal Home Rule Law, within 45 days of adoption of this local law, shall be sufficient to require the submission of a proposition for the approval of such local law at a referendum in accordance with such subdivision. Petition and referendum procedures, including criteria for establishing or challenging the validity of such petition, shall be in accordance with subdivision one of Section 24 of the Municipal Home Rule Law.

Section 5. Effective.

This local law shall become effective upon adoption and filing with the New York State Secretary of State. Provided, however, that if within 45 days after its adoption there be filed with the Clerk of the County Legislature a petition protesting against such local law, signed and authenticated in the manner set forth in subdivision one of Section 24 of the Municipal Home Rule Law by qualified electors of the County, registered to vote therein at the last preceding general election, in number equal to at least 10 per centum of the total number of votes cast for governor at the last gubernatorial election in the County, then such local law shall not take effect until approved by the affirmative vote of a majority of the qualified electors of the County voting on a proposition for its approval.

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LOCAL LAW NO. 2 - 2022

A LOCAL LAW TO REAPPORTION THE ONONDAGA COUNTY LEGISLATURE BY AMENDING ARTICLE II, SECTION 206 OF THE ONONDAGA COUNTY CHARTER

BE IT ENACTED BY THE ONONDAGA COUNTY LEGISLATURE OF THE COUNTY OF ONONDAGA, NEW YORK, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Findings.

Based upon its review and evaluation of all required and appropriate reapportionment criteria, this Legislature hereby determines that the county legislative districts set forth herein are as nearly equal in population as is practicable, that no district has been drawn with the intent or result of denying or abridging the equal opportunity of racial or language minority groups to participate in the political process or to diminish the ability to elect representatives of their choice, and that districts comply with principles of reapportionment, including one person – one vote, as required by law.

This Legislature, having duly reviewed and considered these proposed district changes, further finds and determines that this reapportionment plan complies with state and federal constitutional

requirements, as well as all applicable federal, state and local laws. Without limitation, the reapportionment plan uses and meets the requirements of the Onondaga County Charter, the Onondaga County Administrative Code, New York State Municipal Home Rule Law Section 34, and the constitutional protections afforded by law.

This County Legislature encouraged community participation in the reapportionment process by providing for more than seven public hearings, allowing this Legislature to garner an unprecedented level of public input on proposed district changes. This Onondaga County Legislature has duly considered the public comments made throughout this process, and the reapportionment plan set forth in this local law addresses and responds to issues and concerns raised, all within the parameters allowable by law.

The intent of this reapportionment plan is to provide for constitutional and lawful representation, and it is the express finding of this Legislature that the reapportionment plan set forth herein accomplishes that intent.

<u>Section 2.</u> Article II, Section 206 of the Onondaga County Charter is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 206. Districts. For the purpose of electing County Legislators, Onondaga County shall be divided into seventeen (17) districts. One County Legislator shall be elected to the County Legislature of Onondaga County from each of said districts. Eleven (11) of these districts shall be composed of territory within the County of Onondaga totally outside the City of Syracuse; Three (3) of these districts shall be composed of territory totally within the City of Syracuse; Three (3) of these districts shall be composed of territory both outside the City of Syracuse and territory within the City of Syracuse. All references to towns apply to the territory wholly contained in each of the towns of Onondaga County bounded as of November 1, 2021.

The eleven (11) districts within the County of Onondaga composed of territory totally outside of the City of Syracuse are described as follows:

FIRST LEGISLATIVE DISTRICT

All of the Town of Lysander, and a portion of the Town of Van Buren bounded by a line described as follows: BEGINNING at a point at the intersection of the northern town line of the Town of Van Buren and the southern town line of the Town of Lysander and the western village line of the Village of Baldwinsville, which is coincident with the centerline of the Seneca River; thence following the Village of Baldwinsville village line generally southerly, easterly, and northerly to its intersection with the centerline of Syracuse Street; thence southerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Maple Road; thence southerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Van Buren Road; thence southerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of the eastbound lane of Village Boulevard; thence easterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of the eastbound lane of Village Boulevard South; thence easterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Delwood Drive; thence northeasterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Idlewood Boulevard; thence northwesterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of the southbound lane of Village Boulevard North; thence northeasterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of State Fair Boulevard; thence southeasterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Van Ness Road; thence northeasterly along said centerline and its northeasterly elongation to its intersection with the Town of Van Buren town line, which is coincident with the centerline of the Seneca River; thence northwesterly along said river and town line to the point of beginning.

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intersection with the centerline of West Fayette Street; thence westerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Tioga Street; thence southerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Marcellus Street; thence westerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Oswego Street; thence southerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Gifford Street; thence easterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Niagara Street; thence southerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Shonnard Street; thence westerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Slocum Avenue; thence southerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Holland Street; thence southwesterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Sheridan Drive; thence southeasterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Rich Street; thence southerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Tallman Street; thence easterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of South Avenue; thence southerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Onondaga Creek; thence southerly along said creek centerline to its intersection with the centerline of West Newell Street; thence westerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Onondaga Creek Boulevard; thence southerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Ballantyne Road; thence easterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Midland Avenue; thence southerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of West Glen Avenue; thence easterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of South Salina Street; thence southerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of East Seneca Turnpike; thence easterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Seneca Drive; thence northerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Orlando Avenue; thence easterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Monticello Drive North; thence northerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Springbrook Avenue; thence northerly along said centerline and its northeasterly elongation to its intersection with the centerline of East Glen Avenue; thence easterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of East Brighton Avenue; thence northerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of the New York Susquehanna and Western rail line; thence northerly along said rail centerline to its intersection with the centerline of East Brighton Avenue; thence southeasterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Thurber Street; thence easterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Jamesville Avenue; thence northerly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Vincent Street; thence easterly along said centerline and its easterly elongation to its intersection with the centerline of East Colvin Street; thence northwesterly along said centerline to the point of beginning.

Section 3. Separability.

If any section, part or provision of this local law, including without limitation any part or provision relating to any district described herein, shall be adjudged invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall: (1) be confined in its operation to the section, part or provision of this local law or the district or districts directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered, (2) not affect or impair the validity of the remaining sections, parts, provisions or districts, and (3) not affect or impair the validity of the remaining apportionment or districting provided for in this local law. The Onondaga County Legislature hereby declares that it would have enacted this local law of such remaining parts, provisions or districts, had the invalidity of such part, provision or district been apparent at the time of such enactment.

Section 4. Construction.

This local law shall be liberally construed to effectuate the purposes thereof and to apportion and district this county in compliance with the rulings of the United States Supreme Court and New York State Municipal Home Rule Law Section 34(4).

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It is intended that this local law and the districts described herein completely encompass all the area within the county. It is also intended that such districts apportioned on the basis of 2020 population contain all the residents in this county. It is further intended that the apportionment and districting provided for in this local law result in the creation of districts containing substantially equal resident populations. It is also intended that no district shall include any of the area included within the description of any other district.

Section 5. Permissive Referendum.

This reapportionment plan is adopted and is subject to a permissive referendum pursuant to the provisions of Onondaga County Charter Section 207 and Onondaga County Administrative Code Section 2.17. A petition signed, authenticated and filed by qualified electors of the County, registered to vote therein at the last preceding general election, in number equal to at least 10 per centum of the total number of votes cast for governor at the last gubernatorial election in the County, as provided in subdivision one of Section 24 of the Municipal Home Rule Law, within 45 days of adoption of this local law, shall be sufficient to require the submission of a proposition for the approval of such local law at a referendum in accordance with such subdivision. Petition and referendum procedures, including criteria for establishing or challenging the validity of such petition, shall be in accordance with subdivision one of Section 24 of the Municipal Home Rule Law.

Section 6. Effective.

This local law shall become effective upon adoption and filing with the New York State Secretary of State. Provided, however, that if within 45 days after its adoption there be filed with the Clerk of the County Legislature a petition protesting against such local law, signed and authenticated in the manner set forth in subdivision one of Section 24 of the Municipal Home Rule Law by qualified electors of the County, registered to vote therein at the last preceding general election, in number equal to at least 10 per centum of the total number of votes cast for governor at the last gubernatorial election in the County, then such local law shall not take effect until approved by the affirmative vote of a majority of the qualified electors of the County voting on a proposition for its approval.

Legislator Holmquist assumed the chair, so Chairman Knapp could debate. Following debate, Chairman Knapp re-assumed the chair.
