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COUNTY FACILITIES COMMITTEE MINUTES – JANUARY 23, 2024 DEBRA J. CODY, CHAIR

MEMBERS PRESENT: Mr. Knapp, Dr. Kelly, Mr. Brown, Ms. Hernandez ALSO ATTENDING: Chairman Burtis, Mr. Ryan, Ms. Harvey also see attached list

Chair Cody called the meeting to order at 11:30 a.m. and the previous meeting's minutes were approved.

Comment from Chair Cody:

- Welcome new members to the Facilities Committee
- Much of what is on agenda are upcoming routine annual projects that are done this time of year
- 1. FACILITIES MANAGEMENT: Archie Wixson, Commissioner
 - a. BOND: A Resolution Authorizing Reconstruction of the Community Plaza Garage Floor in and for the County of Onondaga, New York, at a Maximum Estimated Cost of \$2,450,000, and Authorizing the Issuance of \$2,450,000 Bonds of Said County to Pay Costs Thereof (2,450,000)
- Asking for release of previously approved bonding authorization for reconstruction of Everson garage floor
- Project has been included in CIP (Capital Improvement Plan) for several years
 - o Paused during 2 COVID years due to budget austerity
- Garage is in need of restoration; has scaling, spalling, and potholes
- Design was completed a few years ago
- Hoping to complete work before additional deterioration requires redesign
- Plan is to mill, restore, reinforce, resurface with 2½ inch layer of concrete, and reset lift station covers
- Would like to start project during better weather and need to find alternate parking
- Expect to be a 3 to 4 month project

Questions/Comments from the Committee:

- Where will alternate parking be?
 - o Either Convention Center open lot or Lot B
- Will there be handicap accessibility to the tunnel?
 - o Not included in this, but can be modified at the loading dock
- Can a lift be put in at the loading dock to the tunnel?
 - o It may make more sense to transition stairs into a ramp

A motion was made by Mr. Knapp to approve this item.

- It was mentioned that this was a patch for existing infrastructure
- Is there a lifespan to the rest of the garage ie: pillars, roof, ceiling
 - o There is not a design useful life
 - o Current conditions do not require consideration of further repair
 - o Condensation and leaking are a result of above reflecting pool that gets resurfaced almost every year
 - o Structurally, it is sound

Dr. Kelly seconded the motion. Passed unanimously; MOTION CARRIED.

- b. BOND: A Resolution Authorizing Courthouse HVAC Renovations in and for the County of Onondaga, New York, at a Maximum Estimated Cost of \$3,000,000, and Authorizing the Issuance of \$2,000,000 Bonds of Said County to Pay Costs Thereof (\$2,000,000)
- Ongoing project that has been in CIP for several years
- Currently spending the \$1.4M previously authorized
- Asking for additional \$2M for next phase
- Replace heating units in the courthouse
 - o 1st target is fin tube radiant heat around the perimeter
 - o Zone valves will be installed for efficiency; will provide more balance and comfort
- Building itself is not inefficient; once warmed up, stays warm; when cooled down, stays cool
- Some deterioration in the infrastructure needs to be replaced
- Engineering complete; contract awarded to Danforth Mechanicals

Ouestions/Comments from the Committee:

- How was Danforth Mechanical chosen?
 - o Chosen under IPA called Gordian
 - Able to streamline procurement process
 - o They are still responsible for insurances and bonding requirements
- What are the lead times on HVAC equipment?
 - Lead times vary
 - o Electrical side currently has 8 to 9 month lead time on switch gear; had to owner procure to meet timelines
 - o HVAC is troublesome with lead times
 - O Been strategic in designs to target equipment that is readily available as opposed to specialty equipment

A motion was made by Mr. Knapp, seconded by Dr. Kelly, to approve this item. Passed unanimously; MOTION CARRIED.

- c. BOND: A Resolution Authorizing Improvements to the Erie Canal Museum in and for the County of Onondaga, New York, at a Maximum Estimated Cost of \$1,300,000, and Authorizing the Issuance of \$1,300,000 Bonds of Said County to Pay Costs Thereof (\$1,300,000)
- Study was done by Crawford and Stearns
- Report has several items that need restoration
 - o Historical retaining wall from old weigh lock station, border retaining walls
 - 150 years old
 - Roof needs supplemental supports; cracks in rafters
 - Do not meet current codes or snow load
 - o Interior side of exhaust chimneys need repointing and restoration
 - o Garden needs to be reset by pavers, stonework and other elements
 - HVAC rehabilitation
- Estimated total is \$1.3M

Questions/Comments from the Committee:

- Stored archives in attic are in danger if repairs not done
- Are there any constraints with it being a historical building?
 - o Yes, however, restoring to original historical condition; not changing anything

A motion was made by Mr. Knapp, seconded by Ms. Hernandez, to approve this item. Passed unanimously; MOTION CARRIED.

- d. BOND: A Resolution Authorizing War Memorial Upgrades in and for the County of Onondaga, New York, at a Maximum Estimated Cost of \$5,210,000, and Authorizing the Issuance of \$5,210,000 Bonds of Said County to Pay Costs Thereof (\$5,210,000)
- Asking for funding to replace telescopic seating; lower bowl seating in War Memorial Arena
- Seats were last replaced in 2010; useful life is 12 years, currently in 14th year
- There is a lot of wear and tear on seats due to being demountable and retractable
- No longer require full retraction of telescopic seating
- New design will have permanent affixed sections and retractable seating in certain areas
- New sound system is included to replace current garbled system
- Total cost will be \$5.2M

Questions/Comments from the Committee:

- What will the design look like?
 - o Have not selected the vendor which is who would be able to produce the seating style
 - o Can produce a rendering; but will not change the appearance to the naked eye
 - o Changes will be in the permanent decking in front of telescopic seating
 - Will be more comfortable and accessible for those with mobility impairments
- Is there an estimated cost for the sound system?
 - o \$900k for sound system
 - o \$4.3M for seating

A motion was made by Mr. Knapp, seconded by Dr. Kelly, to approve this item. Passed unanimously; MOTION CARRIED.

- 2. PARKS & RECREATION: Brian Kelley, Commissioner
 - a. BOND: A Resolution Authorizing Improvements to Various Parks in and for the County of Onondaga, New York, at a Maximum Estimated Cost of \$1,935,000, and Authorizing the Issuance of \$1,935,000 Bonds of Said County to Pay Costs Thereof (\$1,935,000)
- This is an annual ask; encompasses all parks for preventative and routine maintenance projects
- Includes infrastructure items that need to be replaced or enhanced in order to keep parks clean, green and safe
- This is also an emergency fund in case a roof caves in, heat goes out etc.
 - o Emergency situations can include weddings or animals at the zoo

Ouestions/Comments from the Committee:

- Beaver Lake boardwalk
 - o Permitting process with DEC is complete; has taken over a year to receive
 - o Starting construction soon
 - The cost of Beaver Lake boardwalk project is not part of this ask

A motion was made by Mr. Knapp to approve this item.

- Is there a Space Force flag at Veterans Cemetery?
 - Yes, completed a couple of years ago
- Is there a status on the "in progress" PA system at the Zoo?
 - o Status is complete
- What are the various parks?
 - o This year is Highland Forest
 - Highland Forest playground will be a compliment to the Lodge
 - Host over 100 weddings per year

- o Recently replaced some things at Oneida Shores
- o Put in a new playground at Jamesville Beach a couple years ago
- o Considering a play structure at the Zoo to enhance experience
- What is the plan with disabled students?
 - o Currently looking at a tract wheelchair for Beaver Lake Nature Center
 - The wheelchair will be able to all terrain through the trails
 - Looking at similar item for Oneida Shores

Dr. Kelly seconded the motion. Passed unanimously; MOTION CARRIED.

b. BOND: A Resolution Authorizing Onondaga Lake Park Marina Expansion and Rehabilitation in and for the County of Onondaga, New York, at a Maximum Estimated Cost of \$13,700,000, and Authorizing the Issuance of \$13,700,000 Bonds of Said County to Pay Costs Thereof (\$13,700,000)

Comment from Chair Cody:

• Will not be voting on this item today

OBJECTIVE/ WORK PLAN:

The Onondaga Lake Marina will be renovated and expanded, including retaining wall replacement, addition of short-term dockage, expanded parking, additional utility enhancements including lighting, water, shore power. Also, additional dredging will return the marina to the original depths.

- The wall portion of this project has been in the CIP since 2022
 - o 400 foot original wall was built in 1932
 - Sections are heaving and buckling
- Engineering study done in 2023 by C&S Engineering
 - o Study determined the wall is failing and not much more time with it
 - o If wall collapses, DEC will fine county daily until repaired
 - o Wall to be replaced with sheet piling
 - o \$6M for wall
- Need to dredge
 - o Original depth was 8 feet; currently 6 feet
 - o Will not be able to get big boats in if silt continues to build up
- Have not replaced docks in 18 years
 - O Not expanding foot print; maximizing space will allow an additional 40 spaces
 - O Docks will be for transient use for those utilizing the park, village restaurants and shops
 - o \$7.7M for dredging, docks, parking, and updating power
- Marina currently accommodates 100 boats with \$100k annual revenue
- Only want to disrupt footprint once; do entire project at the same time
- Preliminary estimated total is \$13.7M

Ouestions/Comments from the Committee:

- Is there room to expand parking?
 - o Yes; planning an additional 25 spots
- Is there currently short term dockage?
 - o Do not have established program
 - o If there is an open slip, it will be offered
- Is there a waiting list?
 - o Currently 4-6 boat waiting list
 - o Marina fills up with same people each year

- Would dredging be necessary regardless of renovation?
 - o Yes
- What about the fueling station?
 - o Currently on hold; could possibly be a phase II part of project
 - O There is a permitting process and could take some time
- How does that affect the cost?
 - o Will re-address when feasibility study and engineering is done
- Will the feasibility study examine expanding the footprint as well?
 - o Simply putting 40 extra spaces within the current footprint
- Is there potential for expansion down the road?
 - o Possibly with a fueling station
- Are there concerns about toxic materials with dredging?
 - O There are concerns with all projects around Onondaga Lake
 - o The DEC permitting process is strenuous

Law Department

- o The dredge area is not the area of mold; it is outside the capped area
- There has been less discussion about supply chain, but still a concern
- Are there cost concerns through the permitting process?
 - Do not believe so
- Is there a carp tournament coming to Onondaga Lake?
 - Yes; on docket for 2027
- Have seen economic impact at Oneida Shores
- Onondaga Lake has a lot of potential
 - o Have trophy carp in Onondaga Lake
 - Wild carp is appealing to event organizers

Request: Parks Department to provide Legislature with itemized breakdown of \$13.7M ask

- Is there any look forward to carrying cost?
 - o Currently the whole project is absorbed in the Onondaga Lake budget
 - o Do not foresee much change because the footprint is not changing
 - o Staffing and maintenance program will be the same
 - o Increasing the rates will offset bottom line
- Is there a possible estimate of what the economic impact will be?
 - O Do not know right now, but will think about it
 - Never had anything like this before
 - o Easier to gauge with events because there are known factors, ie: advanced registration, hotels etc.
- In the context of economic development, is there a way to think what a project like this might do?
 - o Would be better to do after first year
 - Will be able to track how many people showed up in the transient spots
 - Can talk with local business owners to find out how it impacted their businesses
 - Visit Syracuse knows what the numbers are and then uses a predetermined formula to figure out economic impact

Request: Parks Department will get an economic impact formula for events that do not require hotel stays

- How long will construction take?
 - Marina occupied from April to October
 - o Goal is to get the feasibility study and engineering done through summer; do construction October through April

- Any impacts with amphitheater?
 - O Yes, allows folks to go to a concert, tie up boat, possibly stay overnight
 - o May see increased visitation after concerts to avoid being on the water at night

Comment from Chair Cody:

- This resolution will go to the Ways and Means Committee
- Further questions can be directed to a Ways and Means Committee member
